"GI to IT will assist Veterans to apply their diligence, dedication and ability to turn training into action toward seeking sustainable IT employment."



Free beach passes for Ocean City

Ocean City, N.J. is providing free beach tags for military members as part of their Active Military Beach Tag Program.

The City of Ocean City, NJ has enacted an ordinance to provide free beach tags to active military personnel, their spouse and dependent children over age 12.

Beach tags will be available after June 9, 2012 at these locations: City Hall, 861 Asbury Avenue, Monday thru Friday from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.; Music Pier, Moorlyn Terrace and the Boardwalk, Daily 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. (weather permitting); Chamber of Commerce Welcome Center, 34th Street and Simpson Avenue, Saturday 10 a.m. - 6 p.m., Sunday 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

Active military personnel and their immediate families will be required to present proper identification in order to receive their beach tag. In addition, active military beach tags are not transferrable. Beach tags are in effect beginning June 9, 2012 thru Labor Day.

Beach Tags are required for children ages 12 and up and are in effect from June 9 thru Sept. 3.
