REVERSE CARE PACKAGE



Being thousands of miles away in Afghanistan did not deter a New Jersey Army National Guard Soldier from showing support to neighbors in Brick Township after Hurricane Sandy.

This week, a box postmarked from Camp Eggers, Afghanistan, arrived at the American Recreational Military Services (ARMS) in Toms River.

It wasn't a big box, but Pfc. Morris Thomas's donation of basic needs from socks to hand wipes caught the volunteers by surprise. They are used to sending care packages to the troops, not receiving them.

"This is what it is all about, things going full circle," said Ronnie Micciulla, ARMS executive director.

A garage at the National Guard armory in Toms River is filled with donated clothes, food and toilet paper. Daily, the community has been dropping off items since Hurricane Sandy devastated the Jersey Shore according to Micciulla.

Besides hundreds of local donations, trucks have arrived from South Carolina, Missouri, Michigan and Oregon delivering everything

from disposable diapers to bedding.

The out pouring of support for the military has been wonderful according to Micciulla, but she currently sees a greater need for gift cards.

Volunteers assist displaced service member families in getting items they lost in the storm from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. daily. Uniformed service members in need can stop by the ARMS facility at 1200

Whitesville Road, which will be open through the end of the year.

It was the letter inside the reverse care package that really touched Micciulla.

"Please give our care package to the families that need it most," wrote Thomas and Pvt. Allotta Anthony of Bloomfield. "We are honored to help the victims of Hurricane Sandy."

Both citizen-soldiers mobilized in July with New Jersey Army National Guard's 508th Military Police Company in Teaneck. This unit will be among the

forward deployed troops that will start receiving packages from ARMS early in 2013.
