BORDENTOWN, N.J. -- On Feb. 19, Brig. Gen. Michael L. Cunniff, The Adjutant General of New Jersey, and state Sen. Diane B. Allen (R-Burlington), a member of the Armed Forces and Veterans Council, hosted a tour of the Joint Military Family Assistance Center, along with local elected officials and veterans advocates.

The Joint Military Family Assistance Center provides a full-spectrum of services to New Jersey's 17,000 military reservists and their families, from access to healthcare services to personal finance advice to employment assistance.

In addition, a host of agencies, including the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, the Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve and the state Department of Labor have a presence in the facility, which opened in 2011.

The facility helps all military reservists and their families with issues stemming from deployments as well as any other challenges posed by balancing military service with civilian employment and family life.

The services provided will be further enhanced by the opening of an office for the state Armed Forces and Veterans Council. Staff will be available at this location Wednesday evenings from 4-7 p.m. The 19-member council serves as an advocacy organization for military members.

DoD Announces the Distinguished Warfare Medal

The Department of Defense announced Feb. 13, the creation of the Distinguished Warfare Medal to recognize a service member's extraordinary achievements directly impacting combat operations.

Modern technology enables service members with special training and capabilities to more directly and precisely impact military operations at times far from the battlefield. The Distinguished Warfare Medal will be awarded in the name of the secretary of defense to service members whose extraordinary achievements, regardless of their distance to the traditional combat theater, deserve distinct department-wide recognition.

"I have seen first-hand how modern tools like remotely piloted platforms and cyber systems have changed the way wars can be

fought," said Secretary of Defense, Leon E. Panetta. "We should also have the ability to honor extraordinary actions that make a true difference in combat operations, even if those actions are physically removed from the fight."

Based on the order of precedence, the Distinguished Warfare Medal will sit directly below the Distinguished Flying Cross. It may be awarded for actions in any domain but not involving acts of valor.
