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INTRODUCTION

The Grants Management Office is required to report annually to the Legislature, pursuant to section 2 of P.L. 1991, c. 164 (C:52:14-19.1), a report that describes all federal funds received by State agencies in the preceding fiscal year.

This *Federal Funds to New Jersey State Agencies* report is designed to provide legislators and legislative staff with a comprehensive guide to federal funds that were received by State agencies. The report list federal revenue on a State fiscal year basis and includes descriptive program information to provide a better understanding of the federal programs used by New Jersey State agencies, and of the levels at which those programs are funded. To provide a full picture of grant revenue received, the report also includes federal revenue data from FY2022 and FY2023.

Overview

In FY 2024, New Jersey State agencies received funding from 257 federal programs, supporting 609 State-administered programs. Total federal revenue is estimated to be \$22.155 billion, as detailed in Appendix B. While FY2024 federal revenues are estimated to be down by 6% (\$1.4 billion) from FY2023, this may be attributed to the tapering of pandemic-related funding. Despite this overall decline, the State successfully secured \$121,168,908.61 in new federal funding, highlighting ongoing efforts to identify and obtain additional federal resources. (Appendix C). Table 1 and Figure 1 illustrate trends in federal funding from FY2019 to FY 2024.



Federal revenue changes between FY2023 and FY2024 varied significantly across State agencies. Notable increases in federal funding were observed in the Departments of Education, Labor, Environmental Protection, and Health. In contrast, agencies such as the Departments of Human Services, Law and Public Safety, Community Affairs, and the Treasury experienced substantial reductions in funding. A detailed side-by-side comparison of federal revenue changes for all State agencies can be found in Appendix A.

As shown in Figure 2, the Department of Human Services accounted for the largest share of federal revenue, receiving 72% of the total. The Department of Education followed with 12%, while all other departments, including Health, Agriculture, and Community Affairs, each received less than 3% of the total federal revenue.





Using This Report

Federal program profiles for each State Agency make up the bulk of this Annual Report. These profiles provide detailed descriptions of each program, the FY2024 State programs they supported, and the funding levels they received in FYs 2022-2024. The federal programs in this report were included if the federal funds were received directly from the federal government. Programs in which a State agency received funds from another State agency (subgrants) have been excluded to avoid "double counting," or falsely inflating the dollar totals. Negative amounts include, but are not limited to, a combination of refunds or reimbursements back to the State from vendors for costs under the relevant federal grant. These amounts represent the subsequent return of those funds back to the federal government.

Throughout the report, new or first-time federal awards are marked with an asterisk (*), making them easy to identify. The Table of Contents provides an overview of the federal programs utilized by State agencies from FY2022 through FY2024. This table also indicates where each program's description can be found and lists the federal programs used by each State agency. For an agency-level summary, Appendix A presents federal revenue totals by State agency.

The federal programs, with few exceptions, are listed by their Assistance Listing number. Each program profile include the following:

- The administering federal agency
- A description of the federal program
- The types of assistance
- The intended use of the assistance
- Formula and matching requirements
- The federal account identification number
- A table showing federal revenue received by the state agency in FY2022, FY2023 and estimated revenue for FY 2024

Appendix A: Direct Federal Aid to New Jersey State Agencies, FYs 2022–2024, presents a side-by-side comparison of total federal revenue received by New Jersey State agencies for fiscal years 2022 through 2024. It highlights changes in revenue between FY2023 and FY 2024, offering insights into trends across State agencies over time.

Appendix B: Direct Federal Aid to New Jersey State Agencies by Federal Program, FYs 2022–2024, provides a programlevel analysis of federal aid received by New Jersey State agencies. It compares revenue from federal programs for fiscal years 2022 through 2024, with a focus on changes in funding levels between FY2023 and FY 2024.

Appendix C: New, First-Time State Programs in FY 2024, highlights new and first-time agency programs or initiatives created from FY2024 federal funding. Programs are considered new or first-time if they were not funded within the same agency during the previous five fiscal years.

Appendix D: Related Federal Assistance Programs, includes related federal assistance programs for FY2024 to help identify additional opportunities. These listings highlight other federal programs that serve similar purposes or populations, offering potential pathways for further funding or collaboration.

Appendix E: Assistance Listing, provides a comprehensive directory of federal assistance programs. The Assistance Listing numbers serve as a reference tool, ensuring clarity and consistency in identifying and tracking federal funding sources.

Information Sources

The source for the fiscal data included in *the Federal Funds to New Jersey State Agencies* report were provided by the New Jersey Department of the Treasury's Office of Management and Budget. The data reflects all federal revenue received by the State of New Jersey between Fiscal Years 2019-2024. The Fiscal Year 2024 data is as of October 20,


2024 and still subject to change pending the final Single Audit for Fiscal Year 2024. The data was extracted from the New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System, which is the State's accounting system. It should also be noted that the data *does not* include federal revenues awarded and provided directly to authorities or other quasi-governmental agencies that are not on the State's accounting system.

The primary source for the federal program descriptive information is the Assistance Listing (formerly and commonly referred to as Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA)) from SAM.gov. The federal programs, with few exceptions, are identified by Assistance Listing number. The first two digits of the number identify the federal agency from which the grant originates. The next three digits identify the specific grant within each agency. Appendix E shows the basic numbering scheme and the corresponding federal agencies.

NJ DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

In FY2024, the Department of Agriculture received a total of \$662,143,036.49 in federal funding. The department received funding from 22 different federal programs, across 2 federal agencies. These federal funds supported 44 State of New Jersey programs, including 5 new initiatives.

The table below outlines the annual federal funds received by the Department of Agriculture from 2019 to 2024.



+ FY2024 data is unaudited and as of 10/20/2024.

The federal revenues for the Department of Agriculture in FY2024 showed an 8% (\$58,193,519.76) decrease from FY2023. This decline may be primarily due to the reduction in pandemic-related funding. Revenues for FY2024 are 32% higher than the pre-pandemic levels in FY2019.

FY2024 Notable Funding Changes:

- Increase: The department observed a notable increase in funding of \$13,499,484.87 from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Child and Adult Care Food Program (10.558).
- **Decrease**: The department observed substantial funding reductions in two programs from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The National School Lunch Program (10.555) decreased by \$46,811,859.89 and the Summer Food Service Program for Children (10.559) decreased by \$20,584,161.03.
- New Funding: The department received first-time funding totaling \$5,549,827.20 from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Local Food for Schools Cooperative Agreement Program (10.185), Pandemic Relief Activities: Local Food Purchase Agreements with States, Tribes, and Local Governments (10.182), and the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (10.912).





In FY2024, the Department of Children and Families received a total of \$275,338,630.31 in federal funding. The department received funding from 19 different federal programs, across 2 federal agencies. These federal funds supported 29 State of New Jersey programs, including 3 new initiatives.

The federal revenues for the Department of Children and Families in FY2024 showed an 11% (\$33,116,386.42) decrease from FY2023. Revenues for FY2024 are 3% less than the pre-pandemic levels in FY2019.

- **Increase:** The department observed a notable increase in funding of \$2,067,752.46 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention Grants Program (93.590).





In FY2024, the Department of Community Affairs received a total of \$710,523,370.65 in federal funding. The department received funding from 16 different federal programs, across 4 federal agencies. These federal funds supported 28 State of New Jersey programs, including 2 new initiatives.

The federal revenues for the Department of Community Affairs in FY2024 showed a 22% (\$205,492,604.34) decrease from FY2023. This decline may be primarily due to the reduction in pandemic-related funding. Revenues for FY2024 are 4% less than the pre-pandemic levels in FY2019.

- Increase: The department observed a notable increase in funding of \$24,393,918.87 from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant Program (14.228).
- **Decrease:** The department observed substantial funding reductions in two Covid related programs. The U.S. Department of the Treasury's Emergency Rental Assistance Program (21.023) decreased by \$176,566,666.72 and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (93.568) decreased by \$39,484,822.80.





NJ DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

In FY2024, the Department of Environmental Protection received a total of \$59,272,413.21 in federal funding. The department received funding from 40 different federal programs, across 7 federal agencies. These federal funds supported 82 State of New Jersey programs, including 15 new initiatives.

The table below outlines the annual federal funds received by the Department of Environmental Protection from 2019 to 2024.

The federal revenues for the Department of Environmental Protection in FY2024 showed a 53% (\$ 20,467,224.18) increase from FY2023. Revenues for FY2024 are 74% higher than the pre-pandemic levels in FY2019.

- Increase: The department observed a notable increase in funding of \$20,721,830 from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Performance Partnership Grants Program (66.605).







NJ DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

In FY2024, the Department of Labor and Workforce Development received a total of \$461,872,920.94 in federal funding. The department received funding from 25 different federal programs, across 4 federal agencies. These federal funds supported 42 State of New Jersey programs, including 8 new initiatives.

The table below outlines the annual federal funds received by the Department of Labor and Workforce Development from 2019 to 2024.

The federal revenues for the Department of Labor and Workforce Development showed 22% (\$82,919,895.15) increase from FY2023. Revenues for FY2024 are 60% higher than the pre-pandemic levels in FY2019.



NJ DEPARTMENT OF LAW AND PUBLIC SAFETY

In FY2024, the Department of Law and Public Safety received a total of \$680,915,094.63 in federal funding. The department received funding from 46 different federal programs, across 5 federal agencies. These federal funds supported 76 State of New Jersey programs, including 2 new initiatives.

The table below outlines the annual federal funds received by the Department of Law and Public Safety from 2019 to 2024.

The federal revenues for the Department of Law and Public Safety in FY2024 showed a 41% (\$479,585,162.94) decrease from FY2023. Revenues for FY2024 are 108% higher than the pre-pandemic levels in FY2019.

FY2024 Notable Funding Changes:

- Increase: The department observed notable increases in funding totaling \$25,273,364.23 from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (97.039), and the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Program (97.047).
- **Decrease**: The department observed a substantial funding reduction of \$521,332,555.82 from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Disaster Grants Public Assistance (presidentially Declared Disasters) Program (97.036).



In FY2024, the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs received a total of \$18,078,300.60 in federal funding. The federal revenues for the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs in FY2024 showed a 67% (\$36,594,417.42) decrease from FY2023. This decline may be primarily due to the reduction in pandemic-related funding. Revenues for FY2024 are 57% less than the pre-pandemic levels in FY2019.

FY2024 Notable Funding Changes:

- Increase: The department observed a notable increase in funding of \$1,112,322.69 from the U.S. Department of Defense's National Guard ChalleNGe Program (12.404).
- **Decrease**: The department observed substantial funding reduction of \$34,298,564.10 from the U.S. Department of Defense's National Guard Military Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Projects Program (12.401).
- **New Funding:** The department received first-time funding totaling \$354,015 from the U.S. Department of Defense's Military Construction, National Guard (12.400).









GLOSSARY

Assistance Listing

Formally known as Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA), the authoritative source of information about federal government programs that provide grants, loans, scholarships, insurance, and other types of assistance or benefits to the American public. Search assistance listings at SAM.gov to learn about these potential funding sources.

Assistance Listing Number (ALN)

A unique number, formally known as the CFDA Number, assigned to a program or activity within the Assistance Listings. The first two digits identify the federal agency that administers the assistance.

Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA)

The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) has been replaced by the Annual Publication of Assistance Listings. See Assistance Listings.

Cooperative Agreement

A legal instrument of financial assistance between a Federal awarding agency or pass-through entity and a non-Federal entity.

Discretionary Grant

A grant (or cooperative agreement) for which the federal awarding agency generally may select the recipient from among all eligible recipients, may decide to make or not make an award based on the programmatic, technical, or scientific content of an application, and can decide the amount of funding to be awarded.

Federal Account Identification

The 11-digit budget account identification code(s) that funds the assistance listing.

Federal Agency

An "agency" as defined at 5 U.S.C. 551(1) and further clarified by 5 U.S.C. 552(f). The term generally refers to the agency that provides a Federal award directly to a recipient unless the context indicates otherwise.

Common elements in formulas include population, proportion of population below the poverty line, and other demographic information.

Matching or Cost Sharing

The portion of project costs not paid by federal funds (unless otherwise authorized by federal statute). Matching funds are restricted to the same use of funds as allowed for the federal funds. If it is not allowable under the federal award, it is not allowable as match.

Mandatory Grant

A grant (or cooperative agreement) awarded under a program where the authorizing statute requires the head of the agency or designee to make an award to each eligible entity under the conditions and in the amount (or based on the formula) specified in the statute.

Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Requirement

Stipulates that the State or locality receiving a grant must maintain or contribute a certain level of financial effort in a specified area to receive federal assistance.

Types of Assistance

The form in which the federal government provides assistance to the award recipient.

The purpose for which a recipient entity is permitted to expend funds awarded under a specific assistance listing.
