INTRODUCTION

New Jersey enjoyed a landmark year for film and television production in 2019.

A grand total of 832 projects were filmed here from January to December. This includes 54 features, 11 telefilms and mini-series, 130 television series and specials, 65 music videos, 138 industrial, educational, documentary and short films and 379 commercials.

These productions generated \$421.9 million for the state economy, an annual record. Projects receiving tax credits created 10,300 jobs in 2019. Since the New Jersey Film and Digital Media Tax Credit Program was signed into law in 2018, revenue from film and television activity has increased 530%.

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

During the many years that I have been associated with the New Jersey Motion Picture and Television Commission, one thing has become abundantly clear: filmmakers love New Jersey. They have long embraced our state for its amazing diversity of sites, exceptional talent pool, first-rate cooperation and extremely convenient location. The very same advantages that made New Jersey the film capital of the world during the early silent era still exist today, and to an even greater degree. With that in mind, we recently unveiled our new and very appropriate slogan, "Film in the state where filmmaking began."

It should have come as no surprise, then, that given the opportunity producers and directors would flock to the wonderful cities and towns west of the Hudson and east of the Delaware Rivers. That opportunity arose in July of 2018, when Governor Phil Murphy signed into law the Garden State Film and Digital Media Jobs Act, sponsored by Senators Loretta Weinberg and Paul

Sarlo and Assemblymen Gordon Johnson, Paul Moriarty and Louis Greenwald, and widely supported by both houses of legislature. Finally, a tax credit program was created that allows New Jersey to compete on a level playing field with neighboring states, states across the county, and countries throughout the world. An incentive-driven entertainment industry could now fully consider a state that, historically, has been a preferred choice.

Calendar year 2019 - the first full year under the new program - was a spectacular success. The data presented in this report reflects explosive growth in New Jersey's motion picture and television industry. But charts and graphs aside, the anecdotal evidence is right before your eyes. Film crews are working everywhere in the state. Studio, network and independent productions abound. You may well have seen filming in your very own neighborhood, and you've certainly read about it in the press.

Thanks to the action taken by our Governor and legislature, and thanks to the critical support from the people of New Jersey, our production industry has a future that is blindingly bright. The film industry has come home, and the state will profit immensely as a result.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

It was a very good year - in fact, an excellent one.

There was a dramatic rise in feature film and television production in 2019, the first full year that our new tax credit program was in effect. Never before, in the history of the New Jersey Motion Picture and Television Commission, has the state hosted as many major feature films and television projects in a twelve month period. Within two short years, New Jersey has become the talk of the entertainment industry.

Warner Bros. was the first studio to film here under the incentive program, shooting the billion dollar blockbuster "Joker" in Newark and Jersey City in the fall of 2018. They returned in 2019 to film "The Many Saints of Newark," the

feature film prequel to perhaps the most signature New Jersey production ever, "The Sopranos." David Chase and Lawrence Konner co-wrote this story about Tony Soprano during his formative years. It is set in 1967 an 1969 against the background of the Civil Rights era in Newark. Michael Gandolfini, son of James, plays young Tony, co-starring with Vera Farmiga, Jon Bernthal, Billy Magnusson and Ray Liotta. Scenes were shot in Newark, Paterson, Jersey City, Bloomfield, Hasbrouck Heights and Passaic.

Steven Spielberg returned to New Jersey for the third time, directing "West Side Story" in Paterson and Newark. This Twentieth Century Studios remake of the classic Leonard Bernstein musical presents a fresh take on the classic, Shakespeare-inspired tale of forbidden love and the rivalry between two gangs of different ethnic backgrounds. Clifton native Rachel Zegler plays Maria, opposite Ansel Elgort as Tony.

Zombies invaded Atlantic City in a big way during the filming of "Army of the Dead." Dave Bautista heads the cast of this big budget action/sci-fi thriller set in the aftermath of a zombie outbreak, when a group of mercenaries take the ultimate gamble, venturing into the quarantine zone to pull off the greatest

heist ever attempted. Zack Snyder ("Justice League") directs this Netflix production.

Another Netflix feature, "Beauty," was shot in Paterson, Hawthorne, Clifton, Hackensack, Little Ferry, Lyndhurst, Passaic, Rahway and Rutherford. Andrew Dosunmu directs this drama written by Lena Waithe, about an up-and-coming young singer with a glamorous career ahead of her and the gay woman who falls for her best friend. Aleyse Shannon, Grace Marie Bradley, Sharon Stone and James Urbaniak are featured.

Joseph Gordon-Levitt, Eddie Redmayne, Michael Keaton, Sacha Baron Cohen, Jeremy Strong, Frank Langella and Mark Rylance top the all-star cast of "The Trial of the Chicago 7." Aaron Sorkin ("The West Wing") wrote and directed this Netflix release about the seven very famous defendants charged with inciting the uprising at the 1968 Democratic National Convention in Chicago, among them Jerry Rubin, Tom Hayden, Bobby Seale and Abbie Hoffman. The movie was filmed predominantly in Paterson, Clifton, Newark, Montclair and Hoboken.

Halle Berry makes her directorial debut and also stars in "Bruised," concerning a disgraced mixed martial arts fighter who has failed at the one thing she's ever been good at: fighting. When 6-year-old Manny, the son she walked out on years ago, returns to her doorstep, Jackie has to conquer her own demons, face one of the fiercest stars of the MMA world, and ultimately fight to become the mother her child deserves. Romulus Entertainment produced this drama on location in Newark, Atlantic City and Hawthorne.

"Chemical Hearts" follows a high school transfer student who finds a new passion when she begins to work on the school's newspaper. This Amazon Studios production was filmed in Glen Ridge, Montclair, West Orange, Newark, Harrison, and Emerson. Lili Reinhart, Austin Abrams, Sarah Jones and Bruce Altman star.

Kevin Bacon top-lines Blumhouse Productions' "You Should Have Left," made partly in Jersey City and Cresskill. David Koepp ("Jurassic Park") wrote and directed this horror-mystery about a screenwriter who travels to a remote house in the Alps so that he can write the sequel to his big hit film, but begins to regret his decision after suffering from a severe case of writer's block.

A real estate developer returns to his old neighborhood and must decide to raze or resurrect the family bar. That's the premise of "Last Call," a comedy from Future Proof Films shot in Bayonne, Rutherford and Asbury Park. Jeremy Piven, Taryn Manning, Bruce Dern, Zack McGowan, Jamie Kennedy and Cathy Moriarty are featured.

PassionFlix has made their reputation by turning popular romance novels into movies. Their recent production "Dirty Sexy Saint" was filmed in Bergenfield, Carlstadt, Cresskill, Jersey City and Lambertville. It tells of a young woman who runs away from her wealthy family and romances a small town bar owner with a dark past. Tosca Musk co-wrote and directed; Jordan Lane Price, David Gregory and Luke Guldan star.

Omri Bazalel wrote and directed "Listen," a thriller about a young and dedicated soldier in the Israeli Defense Forces elite intelligence unit, who races against the clock to find an Israeli soldier captured in Gaza before her father's killer is released in a prisoner exchange. Creative Chaos VMG shot this feature on locations in East Rutherford and Fairfield.

"The Unborn" was shot entirely in Jersey City. Mida Films is producing this horror feature about two night security guards watching over a condemned building with a terrible history, and discovering that they are not alone. Tal Lazsar directs a cast that includes Manni L. Perez and Clifton Samuels.

An impressive array of television programs - network, cable, streaming and syndicated - were filmed throughout the state. Programs in virtually every genre utilized the panoply of fresh, picturesque locations New Jersey has to offer.

NBC has worked in New Jersey extensively, and produced two series here in 2019. "The Enemy Within," starring Jennifer Carpenter and Morris Chestnut, deals with an FBI agent who enlists the assistance of a notorious American traitor in an effort to capture a terrorist. Interiors were filmed at the former IZOD Center within the Meadowlands Sports Complex, exteriors were shot throughout Bergen, Hudson, Essex and Passaic Counties.

The second NBC series, "Lincoln Rhyme: Hunt for the Bone Collector," is based on the bestselling novels by Jeffrey Deaver. The show was also filmed at NBC's studio at the IZOD Center, and on location in Bergen, Hudson, Essex, Passaic and Morris Counties. Russell Hornsby plays a retired forensic criminologist who teams up with an ambitious young detective to help capture some of the most dangerous criminals in America. Arielle Kebbel, Claire Coffee and Michael Imperioli co-star.

ABC's "Emergence" is a sci-fi thriller about a police chief who investigates a case involving a young child found near the site of a mysterious plane crash. Allison Tolman ("Fargo"), Alexa Swinton, Donald Faison and Clancy Brown are in this series created by Tara Butters and Michele Fazekas. It was filmed at ABC's studio in Secaucus, in the Jersey Shore towns of Keyport, Atlantic Highlands, Middletown, Berkeley Twp. and Ocean Twp., and in Allendale, Rutherford, Bloomfield, Montclair, West Orange, Passaic, Wayne, West Milford and Perth Amboy.

Producers David Simon and Ed Burns are the creators of "The Plot Against America," a mini-series from HBO based on the acclaimed novel by Philip Roth. The show presents an alternative history of the United States in the early 1940s, where Charles Lindbergh

becomes president and the country falls under fascist influence. Winona Ryder, John Turturro Zoe Kazan, Morgan Spector and Anthony Boyle star. Period '40s locations were replicated in Newark, Paterson, West Orange, East Orange, Maplewood, Jersey City, Clifton, Union, Cranford and Hoboken.

"Little America" is an anthology series that tells funny, romantic, heartfelt, inspiring and surprising stories of immigrants in America. It stars a very ethnically diverse cast, and each episode is directed by directors from around the globe. Although the entire first season was shot throughout New Jersey, these towns were used to represent different states from coast to coast: Wrightstown, Atlantic City, Tuckerton, Belford, Lyndhurst, North Arlington, Kearny, Rockleigh, Rutherford, Caldwell, Cedar Grove, Newark, Bloomingdale, Passaic, Paterson, Berkeley Heights, Highland Park, Metuchen, Florham Park, Allamuchy and Madison. The program streams on Apple TV+.

Another Apple TV+ series, "Dickinson," was filmed partly in Jersey City and East Amwell. Anonymous Content is producing Season Two of this historical drama that offers an inside look at the world of writer Emily Dickinson. Hailee Steinfeld plays

the title role, supported by Anna Baryshnikov, Adrian Enscoe and Jane Krakowski.

Al Pacino stars in his first television series, "Hunters," from Big Indie Pictures. Set in 1977, the show follows a troubled young Jewish man bent on revenge, who is taken in by a secret group of Nazi hunters fighting a clandestine war against a cabal of former high-ranking Nazi officials. The distinguished cast includes Logan Lerman, Jerrika Hinton, Lena Olin, Saul Rubinek, Carol Kane, Josh Radnor, Jeannie Berlin, James Le Gros and Dylan Baker. Episodes of this Amazon Prime series were shot in Paterson and Newark.

The pilot for a USA Network series, "Masters of Doom," was shot in Montclair, Mount Olive, Paterson and Union. It is the fact based story of how a pair of computer whizzes created one of the biggest video game franchises of the 90s. James Franco and Dave Franco are executive producers of the show, Siobhan Williams, Patrick Gibson and Eduardo Franco head the cast.

"Free Meek" chronicles the life of Philadelphia based rap artist Meek Mill, from his rise in music to his incarceration and

eventual release from prison. Jay-Z and Meek Mill executive produced this series, streaming on Amazon Prime and starring Julian Blondell and Van Jones. Filming took place in Woodbury.

Scenes from episodes of several other popular television shows were filmed in New Jersey throughout the year, including "Madam Secretary" (CBS), FBI: Most Wanted (CBS) and The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel (Amazon Prime). Production of reality television series continued at a torrid pace, with 55 such programs done here in 2019. Many familiar titles dot the list, among them the venerable "Ink Master" (Paramount Network), "What Would You Do?" (ABC), "Love and Hip Hop: New York" (VH-1), "Queer Eye" (Netflix), "Mysteries at the Museum" (Travel Channel), "Bridezillas" (WEtv), "House Hunters International" (HGTV) and the ever popular "The Real Housewives of New Jersey" (Bravo).

Viacom produced two live telecasts from Newark in August. "Black Girls Rock" rocked The New Jersey Performing Arts Center. This awards ceremony honors women of color for their achievements in music, entertainment and entrepreneurship, and presents live musical performances by R&B and soul recording artists. Niecy Nash hosted, with appearances by Angela Bassett, Regina King, H.E.R., Ciara, Common and many others. The show aired on BET.

The Prudential Center in Newark then hosted "The 2019 MTV Video Music Awards," Viacom's biggest awards show of the year. It was a live, star-studded event hosted by comedian Sebastian Maniscalco, and featuring Alison Brie, Hailee Steinfeld, John Travolta, Jamie-Lynn Sigler, Drea de Matteo, Taylor Swift, Miley Cyrus, Ice-T, Cardi B, Billie Eilish, Camila Cabello, Lenny Kravitz, Shawn Mendes, and many, many others. A live remote with the Jonas Brothers was telecast from Asbury Park, as part of this thoroughly Jersey night when the state was lauded over and over by the presenters and award winners.

The 65 music videos shot in New Jersey last year feature such artists as Marion Hill, Misfitz, New Kids on the Block, Jidenna, The Record Company and Janet Gardner.

The year brought 138 industrial, documentary, educational and short films to the state, and 379 commercials advertising such brands as American Express, BMW, Entenmann's, Kate Spade, Kohl's, Levi's, Miller Lite, NFL, Panera, Ray-Ban, Skittles, Target, Toyota, United Airlines, Verizon and Walmart.



ECONOMIC IMPACT

Cameras were rolling throughout New Jersey in 2019. The 832 productions made here during the year enhanced the local economy by \$422 million, and created thousands of jobs for our residents. This record amount of revenue reflected a sharp increase in the filming of major motion pictures and television programs in the state, as New Jersey has quickly become a destination of choice for studios, networks and independent production companies.

The remarkable jump in revenue is attributable to the scale of the productions being made here, and the overall sharp increase in the amount of shooting days. The union locals serving the production industry reported record levels of employment. And businesses and merchants throughout New Jersey benefited substantially from the production renaissance the state has been experiencing.

A production company working in a community can enrich local coffers in many ways. They patronize a wide variety of businesses including hardware and lumber suppliers, hotels, restaurants, caterers, dry cleaners, auto dealers and repair

shops, florists, realtors, and equipment companies; and utilize an array of services provided by lawyers, accountants, doctors, tutors, electricians, plumbers, and other professionals and tradespeople. Expenditures range from small purchases, such as donuts and coffee, to major costs such as site rentals, hiring off duty police and extras, and renting camera and lighting equipment. Most major productions will spend many millions of dollars in the state and, cumulatively, hundreds of millions of dollars a year, billions over the course of several years.

Let's look at some prime examples among the 2019 projects made in New Jersey. One of the most elaborate productions of the year was "West Side Story," Steven Spielberg's remake of the classic Leonard Bernstein/Stephen Sondheim musical. Filming took place for 30 days in Paterson and Newark, where 20th Century Studios spent approximately \$20 million and created 1572 jobs. Netflix shot its post-apocalyptic zombie epic "Army of the Dead" in Atlantic City for 30 days, enhancing the local economy by about \$27 million and hiring 675 cast and crew members. "Beauty," also from Netflix, was made in Paterson, Hawthorne, Clifton, Hackensack, Little Ferry, Lyndhurst, Passaic, Rahway and Rutherford over the course of a month, with an \$8 million spend and a cast and crew of 90. Writer/director Aaron Sorkin helmed

"The Trial of the Chicago 7" for 30 days in Paterson, Newark, Clifton, Montclair and Hoboken, where Paramount Pictures spent roughly \$30 million and hired 350 people. "Chemical Hearts," an Amazon Studios production, was shot in Glen Ridge, Montclair, West Orange, Newark, Harrison, and Emerson with a \$8 million spend and 90 hires. Halle Berry's directorial debut, "Bruised" was filmed by Romulus Entertainment in Atlantic City, Newark and Hawthorne for 20 days, with expenditures of almost \$10 million and a cast and crew of 725. And Warner Bros.' "The Many Saints of Newark" the long awaited prequel to "The Sopranos" co-written and executive produced by David Chase, reported \$5 million worth of expenses while hiring 650 people during its two week shoot.

The economic impact of television series is even more impressive, due to the considerable production costs and lengthy shooting schedules required to complete a full season's worth of shows. For example, 13 episodes of ABC'S mystery/sci-fi thriller "Emergence" were filmed in Ocean and Monmouth Counties and in North Jersey with a spend of about \$50 million and a hire of 250. NBC produced 12 episodes of "Lincoln Rhyme: Hunt for the Bone Collector" here, contributing approximately \$40 million to the local economy and producing 665 jobs in Bergen, Hudson, Essex, Passaic and Morris Counties. "The Plot Against America,"

HBO's elaborate six episode mini-series based on Philip Roth's novel, generated a \$30 million spend and created 1000 jobs. The Apple TV+ anthology series "Little America" shot a six episode first season throughout the entire state, accruing almost \$35 million in expenses and putting 350 people to work. The pilot episode of USA Network's "Masters of Doom" produced a \$10 million spend and employed 200 cast and crew members.

The filming of motion pictures and television programs requires a lot of cooperation from host towns, and production companies often express their appreciation in generous ways. Beyond spending a great deal of money in local areas for purchases, rentals and hires, they often make sizeable contributions to local non-profit organizations and educational institutions. For example, during the filming of "West Side Story," Twentieth Century Fox donated \$5,400 to the Newark Boys Club, \$2,500 to the Paterson Latino Center, \$7,000 to the Paterson Task Force (in support of disadvantaged men and women needing professional attire and career development assistance), \$10,000 to the Paterson Special Improvement District, and \$35,000 to Passaic County College (to sponsor enrollment of minority students). NBC donated \$1,500 to Seton Hall Prep (to offset minority student tuition) during the shooting of the television series "Lincoln

Rhyme: Hunt For The Bone Collector.” When the mini-series “The Plot Against America” was in production, HBO donated \$1,500 to the Newark Community Food Bank, \$3,000 to Weequahic High School and \$3,000 to the Chancellor Avenue Elementary School, both in Newark, and \$4,500 to the Cranford Downtown Business District to pay for needed improvements. Such acts of generosity have become commonplace, and further underscore the value of fostering an active production industry.

The intangible benefits of having movies and television shows filming throughout New Jersey may not be easily quantifiable, but they are extraordinarily important nonetheless. The indelible images of the state captured by the highly talented filmmakers working here throughout the course of the year are displayed on movie and television screens throughout the world. They advertise New Jersey in a powerfully effective way, conveying a message that this is a desirable place to live, work and vacation. The many well-known celebrities, artists and craftspeople associated with our high profile productions get to know our cities and towns more intimately, and become unofficial ambassadors for the state. 
