


Maternal and Infant Health Crisis

- U.S Maternal Mortality rate the highest amongst highincome countries
- 80% of those deaths are preventable
- New Jersey has moved in ranking from 47th to 27th in the nation
 - Disparities persist
 - Black mother 7x more to die from pregnancy-related complications than a white mother
 - Hispanic mother 5x more to die from pregnancy-related complications than a white mother
 - Black baby is over 3x more likely than a white baby to die before his or her first birthday



Nurture NJ

- First Lady Tammy Murphy launched Nurture NJ Campaign in 2019.
- 2021 Nurture NJ unveiled the Nurture NJ Maternal and Infant Health Strategic Plan.
 - Blueprint to reducing New Jersey's maternal mortality by 50 percent over five years and eliminating racial disparities in birth outcomes;
 - Whole of government approach 21 state agencies;
 - Over 80 recommendations

MIHIA (Maternal and Infant Health Innovation Authority)

- New state authority devoted to advancing best-in-class maternal/infant care
- Permanent through legislation
- Unique hybrid model state-funded + donor supported
- Focus on policy, thought leadership, research, innovation, and workforce development
- Implementer of Nurture NJ Strategic Plan recommendation 3.3 - Establish a Trentonbased Center known as the Maternal and Infant Health Innovation Center (MIHIC)

Maternal and Infant Health Innovation Authority

- Established in 2023 through legislation S3864, known as the New Jersey Maternal and Infant Health Innovation Center Act.
- Advancing maternal and infant health care and clinical services throughout the State.
- Coordinating, promoting, and implementing education, policymaking, research, innovation, perinatal workforce development and more, with a particular focus on eliminating racial disparities in maternal and infant health outcomes.





MIHIA's Goals


- Eliminate racial disparities in New Jersey
- Move New Jersey from 27th in the nation to first in the nation
- Diversify and build the perinatal workforce
- Implement innovative clinical and social service approaches to addressing maternal health in Trenton with an eye towards statewide expansion
- Establish strategic partnerships locally, statewide, nationally, and globally
- Share best practices and learn from others





Nurture NJ Strategic Plan: Recommendation 3.3

- Establish a Center in the state capital that focuses on innovation and research in maternal and infant health through partnerships with the state's academic, funder, business and faith communities.
- The Center will...
 - Be an academic hub for job development, training, and placements for Trenton public school students, Trenton residents and the state
 - Provide social service supports for Trenton moms and families
 - Offer must needed clinical services
 - House an Incubator space to support the emerging market of early-stage entrepreneurs and local businesses





APPLY FOR TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE



- . If you are experiencing a high-risk pregnancy and need transportation assistance, request a Maternal Infant Health (MIH) application.
- · Completed applications are reviewed daily.
- · Eligibility for services are based on your individual circumstances and require verification from a health care professional



- · Applications accepted via email or mail.
- 1:1 assistance available via phone.
- Medical condition, related to pregnancy, must be verified by a doctor.
- · All eligibility determination letters are mailed or emailed.
- · Extension request will be considered.
- · Applications are only reviewed Mon-Fri.
