Re: Temporary Procedure for Evidential Breath Test Utilizing

Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C Instruments for Standard Time Period

October 30 - November 6, 2022

In 2007, the federal Energy Policy Act, 42 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 15801, changed the dates of ending Daylight Savings Time from the last Sunday in October to the first Sunday in November.

The Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C New Jersey firmware version 3.11 is configured to automatically revert to Eastern Standard Time based on the pre-2007 timetable. Instead of changing to Eastern Standard Time on November 6, 2022, the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C will change on October 30, 2022. Commencing at 02:00 on October 30, 2022, the instrument will record all times, both printed and electronic, with an "S" suffix, indicating Standard Time.

The instrument's recordation of Standard Time rather than Daylight Savings Time does not affect the method of analysis or the accuracy of the readings. All current procedures for the processing of arrested intoxicated drivers are to continue, including the 20-minute observation period currently part of the regular protocol. However, because the <u>Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C</u> is set to read in Standard Time for the week between October 30 and November 6, <u>Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C</u> Breath Test Operators should enter the time of arrest in the Alcotest 7110 MKIII-C instrument in <u>Standard Time (one hour earlier than Daylight Savings Time)</u>. Entries on all other documents related to the arrest (e.g., police reports) should reflect Daylight Savings Time which will remain in effect until November 6, 2022.

Please note that the Alcotest 9510 firmware is configured to automatically revert to Eastern Standard Time based on the post-2007 timetable. Thus, the arrest time instructions for Alcotest 7110 Breath Test Operators does NOT apply for Alcotest 9510 Breath Test Operators.
