ARREST SUMMARY FOR NON-INDEX OFFENSES

MANSLAUGHTER

Definition

The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence. Arrests relating to traffic fatalities are included.

- There were 38 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for manslaughter during the year, an increase of 31 percent when compared to 2005.
- Adults accounted for 87 percent and juveniles accounted for 13 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 84 percent of the arrests and females 16 percent.
- Seventy-nine percent of the persons arrested were white and 18 percent were black and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 29 percent of the arrests and 71 percent were non-Hispanic.

SIMPLE ASSAULT

Definition

Simple assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were 29,191 simple assault arrests in 2006, representing a decrease of 7 percent when compared to 2005.
- Of the total, 18 percent were juveniles and 82 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 75 percent and females 25 percent of the persons arrested for simple assault.
- Sixty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 34 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- Twenty percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 80 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

ARSON

Definition

Under this program, arson is defined as the willful or malicious burning, or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud; a dwelling, house, building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of building, personal property of another, etc..

- There were 480 arrests reported for arson offenses, a 26 percent increase compared to 2005.
- Juveniles accounted for 64 percent and adults 36 percent of persons arrested for arson.
- Eighty-nine percent of the total arson arrests were males while 11 percent were females.
- Seventy-six percent of the persons arrested were white, 21 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 10 percent of those arrested and non-Hispanics accounted for 90 percent.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

Definition

The definition of forgery and counterfeiting is the making, altering, uttering or possessing or attempting to make, alter, utter or possess, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true.

- There were 2,128 arrests reported during the year for forgery or counterfeiting, a 6 percent decrease compared to 2005.
- Adults accounted for 97 percent and juveniles accounted for 3 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 73 percent of the arrests and females 27 percent.
- Sixty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 33 percent were black, and the balance were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 28 percent of the arrests and 72 percent were non-Hispanic.

FRAUD

Definition

In Uniform Crime Reporting, fraud is the fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were 5,392 arrests reported during the year for fraud, which is an 11 percent decrease compared to 2005.
- Adult arrests represented 98 percent and juveniles 2 percent of the persons arrested.
- Males accounted for 69 percent and females 31 percent of the persons arrested for fraud.
- Sixty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 34 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- Twenty percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 80 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

EMBEZZLEMENT

Definition

The definition of embezzlement is the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- There were 121 persons arrested for embezzlement, a 27 percent increase compared to 2005.
- Ninety-four percent of those persons arrested were adults and 6 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 60 percent and females 40 percent of the persons arrested for embezzlement.
- Sixty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, and 34 percent were black and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 10 percent of those arrested and non-Hispanics accounted for 90 percent.

STOLEN PROPERTY

(Buying, Receiving, Possessing)

Definition

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- In 2006, there were 5,536 arrests reported for stolen property, a decrease of 1 percent compared to 2005.
- Of the total, 73 percent were adults and 27 percent were juveniles.
- Eighty-five percent were males and 15 percent were females.
- Fifty-five percent of the persons arrested were black, 44 percent were white, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 19 percent of the arrests and 81 percent were non-Hispanic.

CRIMINAL/MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

Definition

Criminal/Malicious mischief is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were 8,081 arrests for criminal/malicious mischief, an increase of 8 percent compared to 2005.
- Of the total, 52 percent were adults and 48 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 86 percent and females 14 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 25 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Sixteen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and non-Hispanics accounted for 84 percent.

WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, etc.

Definition

Under this program, this offense includes all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were 6,639 arrests reported for weapon offenses, an increase of 1 percent when compared to 2005.
- Of the total, 69 percent were adults and 31 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 91 percent and females 9 percent of those arrested.
- Fifty-two percent of the persons arrested were black, 47 percent were white, and the balance were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 19 percent of those arrested and 81 percent were non-Hispanic.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

Definition

Prostitution and commercialized vice are sex offenses of a commercialized nature and attempts. Included in this category are prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, etc..

- There were 2,104 prostitution and commercialized vice arrests during 2006, representing a decrease of 18 percent when compared to 2005.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent, and juveniles 1 percent of the arrests.
- Thirty-nine percent were males and 61 percent were females.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 41 percent were black, and 6 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 23 percent of those arrested and 77 percent were non-Hispanic.

SEX OFFENSES

Definition

Sex offenses, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Program, do not include rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Included in this class are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like; attempts are also included.

- There were 1,876 sex offense arrests during 2006, representing a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2005.
- Adults accounted for 81 percent, and juveniles 19 percent of the arrests.
- Ninety-six percent were males and 4 percent were females.
- Sixty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, 30 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- Twenty-six percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 74 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

Definition

Under the program, drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacturing/possession/use of the below listed narcotics and drugs:

- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics—manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction—(Demerol, methadone).
- d. Other—dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens).

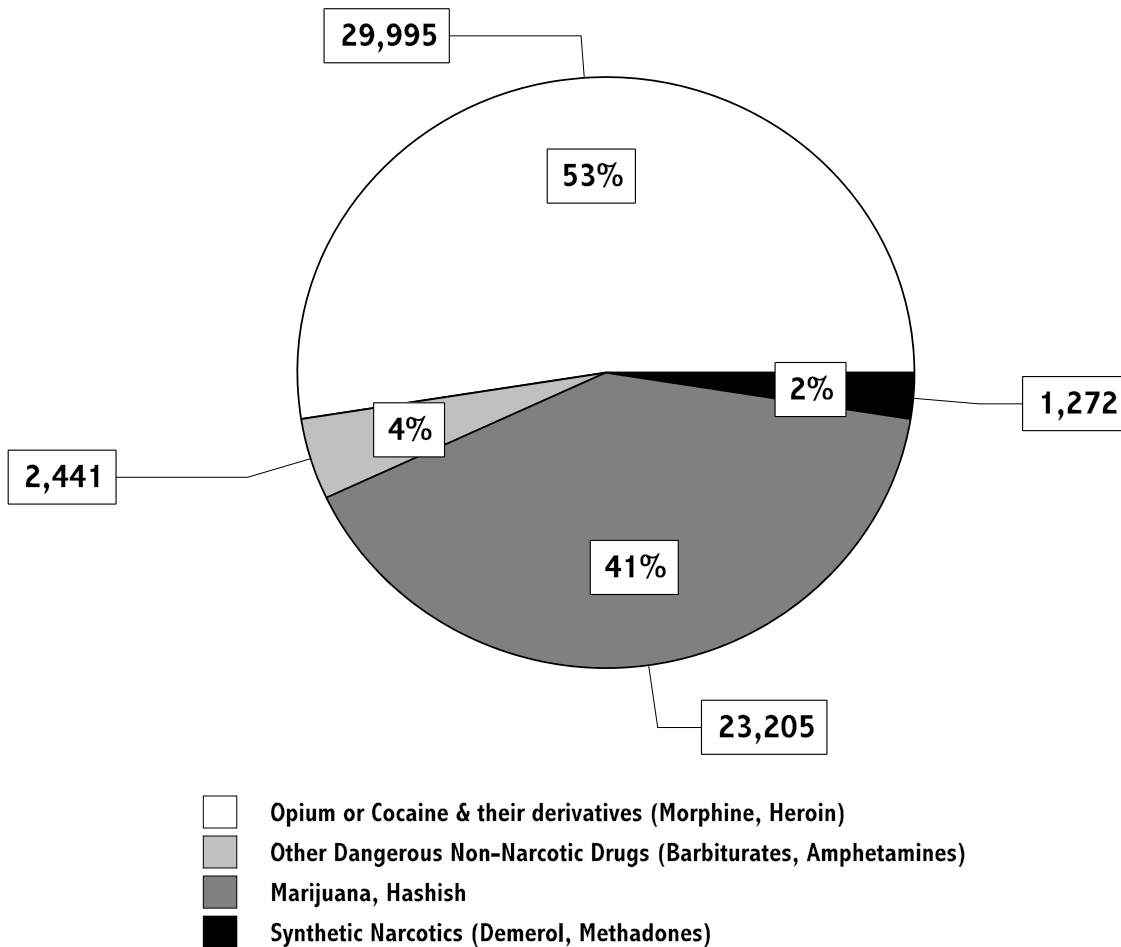
- There were 56,913 arrests reported by the law enforcement agencies of the state for drug abuse violations, a decrease of less than one-half of one percent when compared to 2005.
- Adults accounted for 88 percent and juveniles 12 percent of the arrests.

- Thirty-two percent of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were under the age of 21.
- Males accounted for 84 percent of all the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 16 percent.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 45 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 14 percent of those arrested and 86 percent were non-Hispanic.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 77 percent of the arrests, and the remaining 23 percent were for the sale/manufacturing of drugs.
- Arrests for opium or cocaine and their derivatives represented 47 percent of the possession/use category and 72 percent of the sale/manufacturing category. Overall, they accounted for 53 percent of the total drug abuse violation arrests.

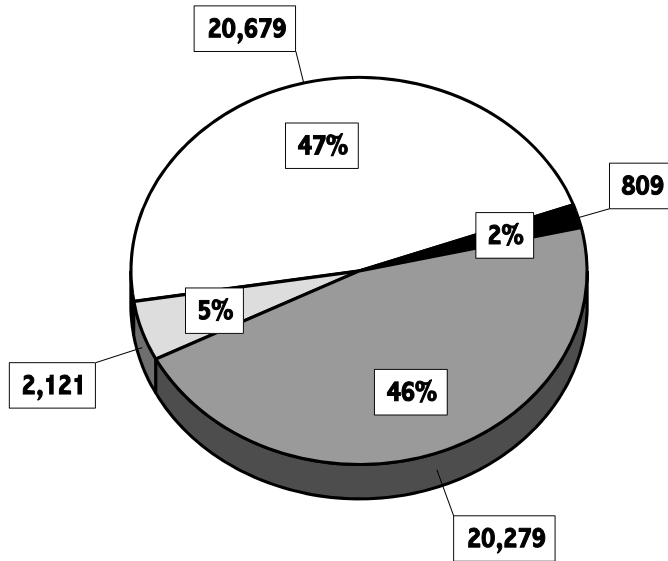

POSSESSION/USE ARRESTS

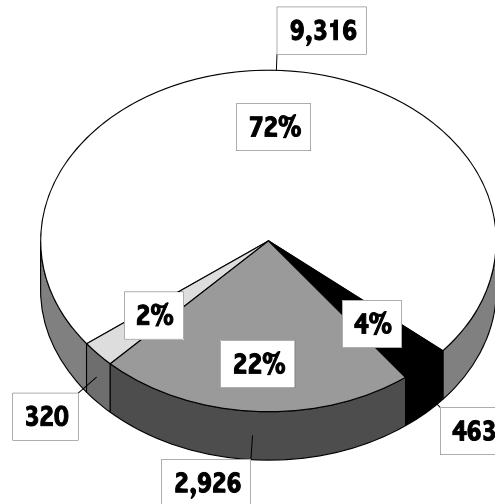

GAMBLING

Definition

Gambling violations are defined as the promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.

- There were 503 gambling arrests reported during 2006, resulting in a decrease of 2 percent compared to 2005.
- Ninety-one percent of the arrests were adults and 9 percent were juveniles.
- Males represented 83 percent and females 17 percent of the gambling arrests.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 42 percent were black, and 5 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 18 percent of the arrests and 82 percent were non-Hispanic.

OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN

Definition

The definition of offenses against family and children is the nonsupport, neglect, desertion or abuse of family and children.

- There were 15,355 arrests for offenses against family and children during 2006, representing an increase of 3 percent from 2005.
- Less than one-half of one percent of the arrests were juveniles, and 99.8 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 90 percent and females 10 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 45 percent were black, while other races accounted for 1 percent.
- Hispanics accounted for 13 percent of the arrests and 87 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

Definition

Under the New Jersey Crime Reporting Program, the offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were 29,270 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 2006, an increase of less than one-half of one percent compared to 2005.
- Ninety-nine percent of the arrests were adults and only 1 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 81 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 19 percent.
- Eighty-six percent of the persons arrested were white, 11 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- Eighteen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 82 percent were non-Hispanic.

LIQUOR LAWS

Definition

Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of “driving under the influence.”

- There were 9,363 arrests reported for liquor law violations, an increase of 13 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 68 percent of the arrests while the remaining 32 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 74 percent of the liquor law arrests while females accounted for the remaining 27 percent.
- Ninety-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 8 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 10 percent of those arrested and 90 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Definition

In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were 22,240 arrests reported for disorderly conduct, which was a decrease of less than one-half of one percent when compared to 2005.
- Adults were responsible for 76 percent of the arrests while the remaining 24 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent of the disorderly conduct arrests while females accounted for the remaining 20 percent.
- Sixty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 36 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 18 percent of those arrested and 82 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

VAGRANCY

Definition

In this category are persons charged with vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc..

- There were 1,583 arrests in this category, a decrease of less than one-half of one percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 97 percent of the arrests while the remaining 3 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 73 percent and females accounted for the remaining 27 percent of arrests in this category.
- Fifty-eight percent of the persons arrested were black, 41 percent were white, while other races accounted for 1 percent.
- Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of those arrested and 85 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES

Definition

Included in this category are all violations of state and local laws, except those offenses that can be categorized into one of the specific crime classifications previously mentioned.

- There were 159,040 arrests reported for all other offenses, an increase of 7 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 94 percent of the arrests while the remaining 6 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 20 percent.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 46 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 16 percent of those arrested and 84 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS

Definition

In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

- There were 6,322 arrests reported for curfew and loitering law violations, a decrease of less than one-half of one percent from the previous year.
- Males accounted for 70 percent and females accounted for the remaining 30 percent.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were black, 45 percent were white, while other races accounted for 1 percent.
- Hispanics accounted for 27 percent of those arrested and 73 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

RUNAWAYS

Definition

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, this category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were 5,026 runaway arrests reported, an increase of 1 percent from the previous year.
- Females accounted for 56 percent of the arrests while males accounted for the remaining 44 percent.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were black, 45 percent were white, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 26 percent of those arrested and 74 percent were not of Hispanic origin.
