- The crime rate for Somerset County was recorded at 14.2 victims for every 1,000 permanent inhabitants, a decrease of 2 percent compared to the previous year.
- Murder decreased from 2 in 2008 to 1 in 2009. Rape increased from 15 in 2008 to 21 in 2009.
- Robbery decreased from 133 in 2008 to 111 in 2009. Burglary increased from 784 in 2008 to 801 in 2009.
- Aggravated assault decreased from 137 in 2008 to 134 in 2009.
- The total value of property stolen in Somerset County amounted to \$7.9 million, of which 25 percent was recovered.

- Aggravated assault increased from 90 in 2008 to 104 in 2009.
