

## Volunteers Needed For Victim Advocacy DOMESTIC VIOLENCE RESPONSE TEAM PROGRAM

180-Turning Lives Around, in collaboration with Municipal and Sate police departments in Monmouth County, have teams of specially-trained Volunteer Victim Advocates available to meet confidentially with domestic violence victims at police headquarters. The volunteers, whose identities are kept anonymous, work in conjunction with the police to provide support, information, referrals, options and a safety plan to the victims at the time of crisis. The advocates also discuss with the victim their legal rights in regard to obtaining a Temporary Restraining Order.

There is no fee for the training. Applicants must be 18 years of age or older, have access to transportation, possess a valid driver's license, be willing to serve on an on-call shift basis, and submit to background investigations, fingerprinting and the mandatory 40 hour training. Prior knowledge of domestic violence is not required. Bi-lingual capability is a plus.
