## **INTERACTIVE WEBCAST**

### ***Program Summary***

This intensive trial advocacy program consists of participatory workshops designed to improve attorneys' litigation skills. Students will present opening and closing arguments, examine witnesses and introduce exhibits. After demonstrating each phase of the trial process, students will receive feedback from experienced assistant prosecutors and deputy and assistant attorneys general. The program will conclude with participants conducting a mock trial.

### ***Eligibility***

This program is for new assistant prosecutors and Division of Criminal Justice deputies selected to attend by each county prosecutor's office and the Division of Criminal Justice. Registrants will receive the course materials prior to the program date.

### ***Faculty***

The faculty consists of assistant prosecutors, Division of Criminal Justice deputy and assistant attorneys general and other attorneys who have extensive trial experience.
