Program Summary

This program will detail how to use exhibits during a deposition, when to object in a deposition, and strategies for responding to objections during a deposition.

Eligibility

This program is mandatory for Division of Law deputies who are enrolled in the Deposition Skills Training Program. Other Division of Law deputies are welcome to attend.

Faculty

DAG Michael Sarno is a member of the Health and Human Services Section of the Division of Law. He litigates cases in State and federal courts and the Office of Administrative Law involving the Departments of Human Services and Health, Central Registry matters, civil rights and appeals by nursing homes and other medical entities challenging violations and penalties imposed by the Department of Health. Before that, he practiced in the private sector for over 12 years, including with a large national law firm. DAG Sarno received a Bachelor of Science in Finance with an Economics minor, *summa cum laude* from the College of New Jersey and a J.D., *summa cum laude* from Villanova Law School, where he was a Managing Editor on the Villanova Law Review.
