Program Summary

The term *systemic racism* often arises in current conversations about racial inequality in society. How has the law factored into creating and maintaining a racially biased hierarchy of rights in our nation? This program will provide an overview of ways in which laws have engineered racism into our society. The presenter will discuss some fundamental race-related laws that have contributed to the evolution of America, including who was allowed to be here, who was free, who could be a citizen and who could vote.
