NUMBER OF POSITIONS AVAILABLE: One (1)

<u>DUTIES:</u> Under direction of a Supervising Investigator or supervisory official in the Financial and Cyber Crimes Bureau or in the Division of Criminal Justice ("the Division"), reviews records, files, financial statements, and other transactions to determine and investigate criminal activity; conducts complex investigations; performs confidential and sensitive civil and regulatory investigative activities or specialized investigations to detect alleged noncompliance with, or violations of, New Jersey state statutes; leads and participates in the review and analysis of data, information and evidence collected from criminal investigations; conducts forensic analysis of financial data for the detection and prosecution of criminal activities related to all aspects of financial crimes including securities fraud, tax fraud, mortgage fraud, theft, money laundering, forfeiture, and all computer related crimes; compiles detailed financial findings and conclusions to prepare forensic reports; utilizes computer software, hardware, and FinCEN for gathering and analyzing financial information and records and works with a variety of computer software to assist with trial preparation, including but not limited to litigation presentation software, such as Sanction; provides technical guidance, assistance and administrative support to trial teams; compiles detailed findings and conclusions; conducts data mining and analysis; creates reports on data obtained through mobile device extractions or media; provides technical guidance for digital case management, using analytic tools and systems; assists and attends court proceedings and trials; performs other related duties as required or needed to support the Financial and Cyber Crimes Bureau; performs other duties as required.

REQUIREMENTS

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited college with a Bachelor's Degree.

EXPERIENCE: Four (4) years of experience in the conduct of civil or criminal investigations related to compliance, enforcement, detection, and surveillance activity, including the preparation of investigative reports; **OR** four (4) years of experience in the conduct of investigative administrative audits and/or regulatory examinations of records maintained by businesses and organizations; **OR** four (4) years of experience in the conduct of investigations for the government, the military, consumer protection programs, public advocacy organizations, or the public interest.

Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute experience as indicated on a year-for-year basis.

Completion of a supervised internship field placement of 300 hours in an undergraduate curriculum in Criminal Justice or a related degree program may be substituted for one (1) year of the non-supervisory experience. A copy of your transcript indicating completion of the internship as part of your undergraduate degree program in Criminal Justice or a related field must be provided in order to meet this substitution requirement. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.

A Juris Doctorate degree or a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice, Public Administration, Business Administration, or other related field may be substituted for one (1) year of the indicated experience.

LICENSE: Appointees will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey.

PREFERENCE: Preference will be given to candidates with extensive investigative experience in the criminal justice system, especially those who with applicable training and/or related certifications, including those with demonstrated ability to use litigation preparation and presentation software, such as Sanction.

RESUME NOTE: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.

All offers of employment are conditional subject to the applicant agreeing to and then passing a background check that may include fingerprinting.
