While our focus is on residents, we recognize that family members are often essential partners. We are building a program for families, similar to our work with residents, to support the residents' efforts.





Community Engagement Activities Include...

- Supporting residents to pass legislation and policies that would improve their lives and preserve or expand their rights.
- Working with residents within facilities to strengthen their Resident Councils. (As one resident said, Resident Councils are not just a mandate but a movement. They are a roadmap to creating a better place to live and work.)
- Facilitating resident conversations with groups who are interested in hearing directly from residents.
- Building community among residents of different facilities. Community Engagement hosts a regular Zoom meeting for residents to discuss issues they are facing and solutions they have found.
