To achieve this goal, it is essential for our officers to identify drug dependent individuals and connect them with addiction related services. Taking the proactive approach of connecting these individuals with services ultimately increases their chances of beating their addiction and thus not contributing to crime statistics in our community. Additionally, providing educational resources to the youth of our community regarding the dangers of opioid abuse is a main priority for our agency.

Our department has focused on identifying drug dependent individuals during calls for service and have made a practice with providing them will rehabilitation resources. Galloway Township is also in our early stages of developing social media campaigns to provide information to the public regarding addiction related resources. With our large social media following, this tends to be our best practice for sharing information. Our National Night Out event allowed us to share our message, specifically by advertising New Jersey's Addiction hotline 1-844-REACHNJ with custom made decals as well as presentations to our largest crowd of the year. This allowed us to reach individuals in a large age range from school age to elderly. We are continuing our partnership with Join Together Atlantic County (JTAC) to provide addiction related resources and push our

		Medicine Chest Challenge. Working alongside JTAC, we provided home safes to lock up prescription medication as well as DETERRA Drug Deactivation System Bags to our community. Our Medicine Chest Challenge has been a tremendous success as we collected over 1,000 pounds of disposed medication in 2023.
