CCPD has a dedicated full-time social services coordinator on staff to ensure that established objectives and key performance indicators are tracked and evaluated by our collaborative team daily. Near real-time situational awareness and data sharing agreements are a critical component that drives our ability to effectively measure the right metrics, adapt our plans, shape desirable outcomes, and maintain a common operating picture.

This program addresses the needs of persons with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions who are involved in, are at risk of becoming involved in, or are transitioning out of the criminal justice system through evidence -based or evidence-informed programs or strategies. This program also provides wellness and support services for first responders and others who experience secondary trauma associated with opioid-related emergency events.
Please identify the procurement method utilized for this program, describe the procurement process, and explain why the procurement method identified was used for this program.	Since February 2024, we've interacted with 393 individuals from Camden's homeless community through our weekly outreach efforts. Every Thursday, our team, alongside officers, the Center for Family Services (CFS), and Volunteers of America (VOA), visits areas where the homeless congregate. Officers make introductions, and CFS and VOA engage with individuals, offering services like drug treatment, addiction support, detox, and alcohol rehabilitation. Many interactions focus on mental health, housing, identification assistance, and employment. While not all individuals immediately enter treatment, many express interest in doing so later. CFS and VOA distribute literature and care kits, including toiletries and wound care supplies, and involve EMS when necessary for serious health issues. As of July 2024, two of the five CFS social worker positions have been filled and are stationed at CCPD. These social workers are actively involved in outreach and are available Wednesday through Sunday for walk-ins and referrals. Once the remaining positions are filled, social worker support will be available throughout the week.

Approximately, 738 individual meetings were held in-person, 133 Support Groups were held in-person, and 26 virtual Support Groups, with 90 referrals documented, and nearly 255 external contacts to participants (e.g., telephone, email, text). The Peer Led Recovery Center supported participants by addressing key barriers to sustained recovery. Staff report that housing, homeless services, and social service needs are the top three needs. Funding has expanded staff hours, enhancing support. The center offers wraparound services, including housing assistance, computer access, peer mentoring, support groups, job kiosks, vocational services, and treatment referrals.

	4a) If yes, please explain:	During this reporting cycle, the Post-Crisis Case Management program received 292 referrals. Of these, 25% (72) accepted services, and nearly 80% (43) were referred for additional services. Case managers confirmed 58% (34) of those referrals resulted in admissions or linkages to services such as mental health care, substance use treatment, housing programs, and social services. Staff conducted 215 follow-ups with individuals referred from Crisis. This is a "post-crisis" case management service that is offered to individuals who are screened through crisis, but not admitted to services. This secondary supportive service has been reported to positively impact individuals' overall well-being and quality of life. Case management addressed multiple aspects of health and functioning, helping clients achieve stability, resilience, and empowerment.

	4a) If yes, please explain:	The Mental Health Navigator received 108 referrals from the Project SAVE program. Of those referred, nearly 100% (106) accepted services. An estimated 88% (93) of those enrolled were connected to mental health treatment services. Levels of Care for treatment admissions included MH Outpatient, PHP, Residential, or Private Therapist. Of these treatment admissions, 9% (8) completed treatment, 73% (68) are currently still Engaged, and 18% (17) have Disengaged. The program has significantly improved how the County intervenes and supports individuals in need. By providing personal case managers and court liaisons, the program helps individuals navigate treatment barriers and court compliance, enhancing their well-being and quality of life. This coordinated effort has contributed to a reduction in recidivism and a 39% decrease in overdose fatalities from January to July 2024 compared to the same period in 2023 (NJ-ROIC Drug Monitoring initiative).

The NOPE team facilitating the sessions included a Licensed Social Worker, a Police Officer, and either an individual who had lost a loved one to an overdose or someone in recovery sharing their personal journey and the impact of substance use on their lives and families. The NOPE program achieved significant success in expanding its outreach and impact. Engagement with a large number of schools greatly enhanced the program's ability to deliver essential drug prevention messaging to a wider audience. The presentations were well-received by educational institutions, underscoring the County's strong commitment to youth drug prevention. Positive feedback from both students and educators affirmed the program's effectiveness and relevance, highlighting its success in connecting
		with and educating the youth in our communities.
