Priorities were established by the Hunterdon County Opioid Settlement Task Force after an analysis of data and trends such as treatment access, full ASAM level of care, drug related deaths, Narcan distribution, etc. This information was presented alongside the identified gaps, priorities for funding and recommendations identified in other related plans and planning bodies, such as the Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Abuse Services Plan and annual report of the Opioid Fatality Review Team. Information was cross referenced with the Approved uses, needs assessment survey results and public comment on funding priorities.

A comprehensive community needs assessment was previously done for the County Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Plan, this was used to identify needed services and target groups, existing services and service gaps. A community Survey was also issued to the community through various County Open Public Meeting Boards and placed on the County website. An agency survey was distributed to our local agencies through the County Open Public Meeting Boards, and placed on the County website, in order to identify the needs and gaps as the agencies see them. A listening session was also advertised to the community, where members were invited to speak and provide written testimonials regarding gaps and needs for the funding. An agency listening session was also had where individuals were invited to come and speak offering testimony regarding priorities or the county. The Opioid Settlement Task Force compiled the above information and developed five funding priorities including: Community Education, Transportation, Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT), Housing and the Hunterdon County Hope One program, which were approved by the County Commissioners. Listening sessions were held in Spring 2024, the county open public meeting boards and members of the public were invited to join two public meetings and encouraged community members to provide feedback on the priorities to ensure alignment with the community needs.
