MINUTES OF MEETING NEW JERSEY PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS COMMISSION October 28, 2021 10:00 a.m. by Phone 495 West State Street Trenton, New Jersey

The meeting was called to order by Chair Joel M. Weisblatt.

At the commencement of the meeting, Chair Weisblatt, pursuant to Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, entered this announcement into the minutes of the meeting:

Adequate notice has been provided by the dissemination of a written "Annual Notice of Meeting." On December 10, 2020 a copy of such notice was:

- (a) prominently posted in a public place at the offices of the Public Employment Relations Commission;
- (b) e-mailed to the business offices of the Trenton Times and the Courier Post;
- (c) posted on the agency's web site.

Furthermore on October 20, 2021, copies of an additional written "Notice of Meeting" were posted and sent in a similar manner.

The first item for consideration was the minutes of the September 28, 2021 meeting. Commissioner Voos moved the minutes and Commissioner Papero seconded the motion. The motion to adopt the minutes was unanimously approved (Chair Weisblatt, Commissioners Bonanni, Ford, Jones, Papero and Voos).

The Chair reported that, as noted last month, the Commission continues to operate in the most challenging period, highlighted by the demands of addressing issues related to the ongoing pandemic. These disputes are often particularly contentious and time pressured; many present issues of first impression making resolution more difficult. Nonetheless, what gets lost in the bright lights of highly visible contentious disputes is the remarkable number of cases we get resolved voluntarily. The staff deserves credit for their dedication to resolution.

The Chair further reported that, as an agency we continue to monitor the realities concerning remote or in-person proceedings. We are preparing for the transition back to more in-person encounters with the parties, but retaining the common sense approach of careful consideration of health and safety for both the staff and the parties as well.

General Counsel Lucarelli-Carneiro updated the Commission that an emergent application to appeal to the Supreme Court filed by the unions in the Newark vaccine mandate cases discussed last

month was denied. The General Counsel also discussed the Bergenfield case recently issued by the Appellate Division.

The first case for consideration was <u>Township of Montclair</u> and FMBA Local 20, Docket No. SN-2021-046. Commissioner Voos moved the draft decision and Commissioner Bonanni seconded the motion. The motion to adopt the draft decision was unanimously approved (Chair Weisblatt, Commissioners Bonanni, Ford, Jones, Papero and Voos).

The next case for consideration was <u>Rutgers</u>, the <u>State</u>

<u>University of New Jersey and FOP Lodge 164</u>, Docket No.

SN-2021-040. Commissioner Papero moved the draft decision and Commissioner Bonanni seconded the motion. Commissioner Voos was recused from voting on the matter because she is employed by Rutgers. The motion to adopt the draft decision was approved by a vote of four in favor (Chair Weisblatt, Commissioners Bonanni, Ford and Papero) and one abstention (Commissioner Jones).

The next case for consideration was <u>City of East Orange and East Orange Fire Officer's Association</u>, Docket No. SN-2022-003.

Commissioner Jones moved the draft decision and Commissioner Ford seconded the motion. The motion to adopt the draft decision was unanimously approved (Chair Weisblatt, Commissioners Bonanni, Ford, Jones, Papero and Voos).
