New Jersey Pinelands Commission launches review of the Pinelands Comprehensive Management Plan

NEW LISBON – The New Jersey Pinelands Commission has launched an in-depth review of its Comprehensive Management Plan (CMP), and has slated a series of meetings to gather public comment.

"The Plan review process provides us with a great opportunity to step back and evaluate how we can better meet the Commission's goals," said Nancy Wittenberg, the Commission's Executive Director.

The Commission has implemented the Pinelands Comprehensive Management Plan (CMP), the rules that govern land-use and development in the million-acre Pinelands Area of southern New Jersey, since it took effect in 1981. This is the Commission's fourth review of the Plan.

A Plan Review Committee composed of five Commission members has been formed, and it has set the following schedule of meetings to gather input from the public on the Commission's implementation of the CMP:

■ Friday, August 10th, at 11 a.m., in the Richard J. Sullivan Center on 15 Springfield Road in Pemberton, NJ;

■ Wednesday, August 22nd, at 7 p.m. in the Hamilton Township Town Hall on 6101 Thirteenth Street in Mays Landing, NJ;

■ Friday, September 14th, at 11 a.m., in the RJS Center; and

■ Monday, September 24th at 7 p.m. in the RJS Center.
