PVSC Announces Winners Of Its 2024 Art Competition

Newark, NJ – The winners of the 2024 Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission (“PVSC”) *Art Competition* were announced Monday by Executive Director Gregory Tramontozzi at an award ceremony held at the agency’s Administration Building in Newark.

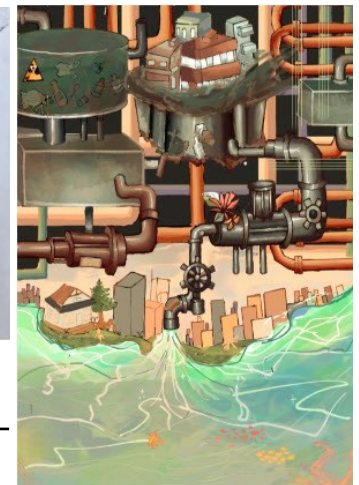


(From left to right) 1st place winner Anahi Guzhnay, 2nd place winner June Paget, and 3rd place winner Angelina Dela Rosa.
