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PVSC Awards \$566,834.26 in Municipal Rebates Through Incentive Program

Newark, NJ – The Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission (“PVSC”) has distributed \$566,834.26 in rebates to various municipalities within its service area, in connection with its Municipal Rebate Incentive Program.

The collaborative initiative between PVSC and its member communities guarantees that all construction projects undergo careful assessment regarding connections to PVSC’s sewer system. Each project must be submitted to PVSC’s Inspection and Compliance Bureau and PVSC Connections Unit inspectors then meticulously review applications and work alongside municipal Building Departments and Code Enforcement Offices to establish the correct connection fee. As part of this program, municipalities receive back 15% of each collected fee, with a maximum of \$5,000 per application.

In 2025, Connections Unit inspectors reviewed 1,909 applications. Of those, 985 were determined to have no impact on the PVSC system and were assigned “Review No Fee” status. The remaining applications generated significant additional flow to the system and resulted in the collection of more than \$10,368,283.31 million in connection and administrative fees. From this total, PVSC is returning \$566,834.26 to its member communities.

“PVSC operates under a strictly regulated framework governing all connections to our sewer system,” said PVSC Chairman Brendan Murphy. “This cooperative program not only ensures full compliance with those standards, but also returns meaningful financial support to our municipalities to help offset the cost of essential services. Our priority remains delivering dependable, high-quality wastewater treatment to the communities we serve.”

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
