

NEW JERSEY STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

INQUIRIES TO BE SUBMITTED TO APPLICANT FOR MARRIAGE LICENSE.

Section 5 of Chapter 193 of the Laws of 1897, entitled "An act concerning marriage licenses," reads as follows: "5. Before any county clerk shall issue any marriage license, as provided in the first section of this act, he shall demand of the party applying therefor, under oath or affirmation, the facts respecting the legality of the same, and he shall issue the said license only if it shall be made to appear before him that no legal impediment to such proposed marriage exists." * * *

The attention of County Clerks is called to the fact that it is unlawful to issue a Marriage License unless all of the following questions are answered.

QUESTIONS TO THE IDENTIFYING WITNESS.

1. Do you know John Nugent or Mary Foley ?

9. Have either John J. Nugent or Mary Foley been married? If so, when, where, to whom, and by whom?
