- The New Jersey Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemorative Commission is proud to offer ten (10) scholarships to current high school seniors who are NJ residents in the amount of \$5,000 per student.
- The scholarships will be awarded based on review of application by the independent reviewers appointed by the Commission.
- Applications will only be accepted via online form.
- Only one (1) entry per student.
- Funds are disbursed directly to schools/ institutions.
- TIP: Write essay in word processing program, then copy and paste finished essays into application.
  - \*\*Applicants selected for final review will be asked to provide:
- Two (2) letters of reference from teachers, advisers, clergy and/or representatives of community-based service programs.
- Official High School Transcript from 11th Grade.

"I accept this award today with an abiding faith in America and an audacious faith in the future of mankind.

- ...I refuse to accept the view that mankind is so tragically bound to the starless midnight of racism and war that the bright daybreak of peace and brotherhood can never become a reality.
- ...I have the audacity to believe that peoples everywhere can have three meals a day for their bodies, education and culture of their minds, and dignity, equality, and freedom for their spirits.
- ...I still believe that we shall overcome. This faith can give us courage to face the uncertainties of the future. It will give our tired feet new strength as we continue our forward stride toward the city of freedom."
