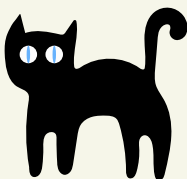
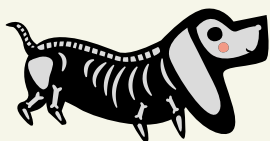

Intertribal Youth Conference November 23rd

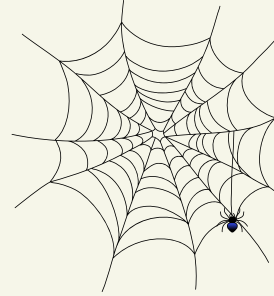

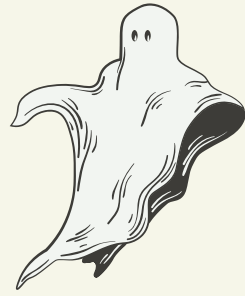
Future exhibits-

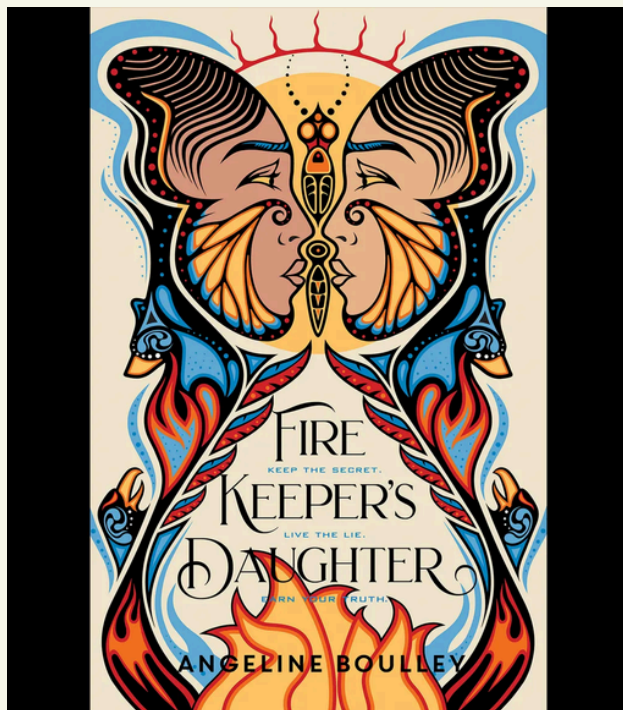
