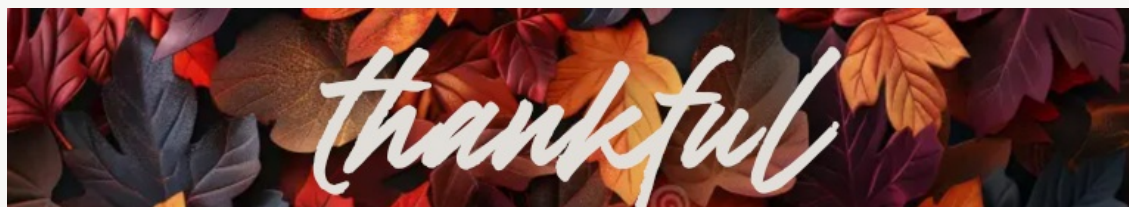

New Jersey Gives Back.



In 2023, more than **1.9 million** residents volunteered through an organization.



This volunteering contributed **\$3.7 billion** in economic value.



More than **3.8 million** residents helped their neighbors informally.



AmeriCorps

Every two years, AmeriCorps partners with the U.S. Census Bureau to take the pulse of our nation's civic health. The 2023 survey looks at many forms of civic engagement between September 2022 and 2023.

In New Jersey:

- 1,910,895 formal volunteers contributed 104,768,245 hours of service through organizations worth an estimated \$3.7 billion. (This is a huge increase from 1.4 million volunteers recorded in 2020)
- 25.7 percent of residents formally volunteered through organizations.
- 22.8 percent of residents belonged to an organization.
- 57.1 percent of residents donated \$25 or more to charity.

- Help children learn to read and provide one-on-one tutoring

Spotlight on Mercer Street Friends

The Send Hunger Packing Program (SHUP) is a meal bag program that helps feed food insecure students over the weekend when they lack access to school meals. Through partnerships with over 30 sites, including the Trenton School District, nearly 60,000 SHUP bags per year are distributed throughout Mercer County. With the help of committed volunteers, over 1,000 SHUP bags with four meals per bag are packed weekly. The SHUP program seeks to close the food gap for school-aged children and limit the effects of hunger on their education and development.



Community Food Bags

In response to schools closing during the COVID-19 pandemic, in March 2020, Food Bank Director James "Butter" Allen created the Community Food Bag program. Adapted from SHUP (Send Hunger Packing), the weekend meal bag program, Community Food Bags provide meals to families throughout Trenton and Mercer County. Since its inception over 250,000 bags, totaling 4 million meals, have been distributed.
