<p>* CAFRA impervious cover limits and vegetative cover requirements</p>	<p>NJDEP, Division of Land Use Regulation</p>	<p>Under the Coastal Zone Management Rules, CAFRA-regulated development located within a CAFRA center, that is, a center, core and/or node that have been adopted by the State Planning Commission and reviewed and accepted by the NJDEP for the purposes of CAFRA, receives higher impervious cover limits than development located outside of a CAFRA center. <p>* Transfer of Development Rights Program</p>	<p>Office of Smart Growth SADC, State TDR Bank</p>	<p>Cost-share grants and technical assistance to help municipalities conduct planning for creation and adoption of TDR program where TDR receiving areas are proposed in smart growth areas. <p>* Low Income Housing Tax Credit Qualified Allocation Program</p>	<p>NJHMFA</p>	<p>The Qualified Allocation Plan (QAP) awards 2 points for projects that are "Ready to Grow". In order to meet "Ready to Grow", the project must be designated as Smart Growth or has water and sewer with one of 6 other criteria. 	<p>TRANSPORTATION</p>	
<p>* Municipal Aid Formula Funding</p>	<p>NJDOT Division of Local Aid and Economic Development</p>	<p>Funds distributed by formula to municipalities for road improvement projects such as resurfacing, rehabilitation or reconstruction and signalization. Municipalities may apply for bikeways, bridge preservation, mobility, pedestrian safety, quality of life, roadway preservation and roadway safety under municipal aid funding.
