15. AND BE IT ENACTED by the Authority aforesaid, That no Person or Persons whatever, who hath made his, her or their Escape from any Sheriff or Goaler in this Colony, (for which Escape the Sheriff or Goaler shall be liable) shall have, or be intitled unto any Advantage or Benefit of this Act, until the Creditor or Creditors, at whose Suit or Suits he, she or they were so arrested, shall, under his, her or their Hands, release to such Sheriff or Goaler, all Cause of Action therefor: And the said Sheriff or Goaler, shall be fully paid such Sum or Sums of Money, as such Sheriff or Goaler may have laid out or expended, for, or by Reason of such Escape. *Provided always*, That no single Person or Persons, able of Body, and under the Age of Thirty-five Years, shall be intitled to the Benefit of this Act, unless he, she or they, shall signify their Willingness to make Satisfaction by Servitude; in which Case it shall and may be lawful for the Court or Courts aforesaid, to adjudge such Debtor or Debtors to render Satisfaction by Servitude, for the Debt or Debts, or any Part thereof, due to the said Creditor or Creditors, and cause such Prisoner or Prisoners to bind him, or themselves, to be Servants by Indenture accordingly, to serve for such Time as the said Court or Courts shall adjudge to be reasonable, not exceeding seven Years, to the Assignees to be appointed by the Court as aforesaid, and to be by them sold and assigned for the Use of such Creditor or Creditors; in which Case, such Prisoner or Prisoners, shall, and may be released and discharged from his, her or their Imprisonment, and the Body of such Person shall be free from Arrests in Civil Actions, during the Time of such Service expressed in the Indenture.

16. AND BE IT ENACTED by the Authority aforesaid, That this Act shall not extend to discharge any Person or Persons, whose Creditor or Creditors shall oppose the Discharge of such Prisoner or Prisoners, and shall insist that such Prisoner or Prisoners be continued in Gaol; and that then, and in such Case, such Creditor or Creditors opposing the Prisoner's Discharge, shall, at his, her and their own proper Costs and Charges, allow and pay a Maintainance of *Three Shillings and Six Pence*, Proclamation Money, per Week, to the said Prisoner; and upon Non-Payment of the same for the Space of two Weeks, the said Prisoner, upon Application to the said Judges, shall be discharged, pursuant to the Intent and Meaning of this Act.

No Debtor to be discharged, when the Creditor will pay 3s. 6d. per Week.

17. PROVIDED ALWAYS, *And it is hereby Enacted*, That Nothing in this Act contained shall be deemed or construed to discharge any Person or Persons from his or their Confinement, who shall have given up his, her or their Estate,

Nor those who assign their Estate to particular Creditors.

18. PROVIDED ALWAYS, *And be it Enacted by the Authority aforesaid,* That Nothing in this Act contained, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to the Discharge of *John De Camp, jun.* now confined in the Gaol of the Borough of *Elizabeth-Town*; to *Peter Adams*, now confined in the Gaol of *Burlington*; *John Sealy*, now confined in the Gaol of the County of *Cumberland*, or to *John Atkinson*, in the Gaol of the County of *Monmouth*; any Thing herein before to the Contrary notwithstanding.

19. AND *Whereas John Budd* hath shewn his particular Difficulties and Distress, and therefore prayed Relief: BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED *by the Authority aforesaid,* That no Person or Persons whatsoever, shall presume to sue or prosecute the said *John Budd*, for the Term of three Years from and after the Publication of this Act; and that all Suits commenced, sued or prosecuted against him, within the Term and Time aforesaid, for Debts contracted before the Publication of this Act, shall be, and hereby are declared void.

20. AND *Whereas Robert Lettis Hooper, jun.* and *George Reading*, of the County of *Hunterdon*, *William Brown*, *William Gerrard*, *Simon Sparks* and *William Clothier*, of the County of *Gloucester*, have shewn, that they have already delivered up all their Effects, and assigned the same for the Use of their Creditors, or the same hath been seized and taken in Execution for the Benefit of their Creditors; and as it seems but reasonable that they should have Relief: BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED *by the Authority aforesaid,* That the Persons of the said *Robert Lettis Hooper, jun.* *George Reading*, *William Brown*, *William Gerrard*, *Simon Sparks* and *William Clothier*, shall not be imprisoned for any Debts by them contracted before the passing of this Act, and that all and every Process now issued, or that hereafter shall be issued, for Debts contracted before the Publication of this Act, by which they or either of their Persons shall be confined or imprisoned, shall be, and hereby are declared void and of no Effect. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the Lands, Goods, Chattels or other Effects, which they or either of them, the said *Robert Lettis Hooper, jun.* *George Reading*, *William Brown*, *William Gerrard*, *Simon Sparks* and *William Clothier*, shall, or may hereafter acquire, shall be, and hereby are made liable to be taken and seized for the Use of their Creditors; any Thing before to the Contrary notwithstanding.

CHAP. XI.

An ACT appointing Commissioners for supplying the several Barracks erected in the Colony of New-Jersey, with Furniture and other Necessaries for accommodating the King's Troops in, or marching through the same; for supplying Deficiencies, and for defraying incidental Charges.

Sect. 1. **W**HEREAS it is expedient, that further Provision be made, for supplying the King's Troops in, or occasionally marching through this Colony, during their Continuance therein: Therefore,

Preamble.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor, Council and General Assembly, and it is hereby Enacted by the Authority of the same, That Daniel Ellis, Isaac Pierson Rodman, Abraham Hunt, Alexander Chambers, Hendrick Fisher, Reuben Runyon, Samuel Sarjant, Thomas Skinner, Robert Ogden and John Blanchard, be, and they are hereby appointed Commissioners, for the several Barracks in this Colony; that is to say, Daniel Ellis for the Barracks at Burlington; Isaac Pierson Rodman, for the Barracks at Trenton; Abraham Hunt and Alexander Chambers for the Barracks at New-Brunswick; Samuel Sarjant and Thomas Skinner, for the Barracks at Amboy; Robert Ogden and John Blanchard, for the Barracks at Elizabeth-Town.

Commissioners.

2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the Authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Commissioners, and the Survivors of them, at each respective Place for which they are appointed Commissioners, as aforesaid, and they, or the Survivors of them, are hereby empowered, as often as Occasion may require, to purchase Fire-Wood, Bedding, Blankets, and other Necessaries, as has heretofore been usually furnished to the several Barracks in this Colony, and as in and by this Act is further directed; and it shall and may be lawful for either of the Treasurers of this Colony, to pay to the said Daniel Ellis, Isaac Pierson Rodman, Abraham Hunt, Alexander Chambers, Hendrick Fisher, Reuben Runyon, Samuel Sarjant, Thomas Skinner, Robert Ogden, John Blanchard, or to any two of them, such Sums of Money as may be wanted for the Service aforesaid, not exceeding the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds per Annum, for the Use of each of the said five Barracks in this Colony, out of the Money made current for the Service of the late War, or now

in the Treasury; and their Order, with a Receipt thereon, or Receipt signed by any two of them, when produced by the said Treasurers, or either of them, to the General Assembly, shall discharge the said Treasurers respectively, their Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, of and from so much as they shall have paid by Virtue of this Act: And the said Commissioners, their Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, are hereby made accountable to the Council and General Assembly of this Colony, for all such Sums of Money as they shall respectively receive, in Pursuance of this Act.

3. *Provided always,* That not any Thing in this Act contained, shall be construed or intended to empower the afore-

said Barrack Masters, or either of them, to draw out of the Treasury, any Part of the Monies afore-
One Regiment.
said, at any Time, until Troops are actually removed to, and quartered in the respective Barracks for which they are appointed Commissioners: *Provided also,* That the Monies hereby given, shall not be applied to purchasing Necessaries for more than one Regiment in the Colony at any one Time, except during the Time of the relieving of the Regiment quartered in the same.

4. AND *Whereas* it is necessary, that the Troops quartered in the Barracks in this Colony, should be supplied with Vinegar and Small Beer: AND *Whereas* Difficulties may arise to the Commissioners, in providing and serving Beer to the said Troops; to prevent which, and that the Troops may be enabled to supply themselves therewith: BE IT ENACTED, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Commissioners, and the Survivors of them, at each respective Place for which they are appointed Commissioners as afore-
Vinegar and Small Beer.
said, to find and provide Vinegar for the Use of said Troops, at the Rate of two Jills for each Man per Week; and in Lieu and Stead of four Pints of small Beer hereby allowed for each Man per Day, it shall and may be lawful for the said Commissioners, to provide and allow to the said Troops, a Quantity of Molasses, not exceeding one Gallon to a Barrel of Small Beer.

5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the Authority afore-

said, That the Commissioners afore-
said, and the Care of the several Barracks within this Colony, shall be under the same Regulations as is directed in and by an Act of this Colony, passed in the Fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, *An Act for appointing Commissioners to take Care of and let the Barracks erected in this Colony of New Jersey, at such Times as the same shall not be needed for the Use of Soldiers; and to sell such Articles therein as are perishable, and have been purchased at the Expence of this Colony.*
