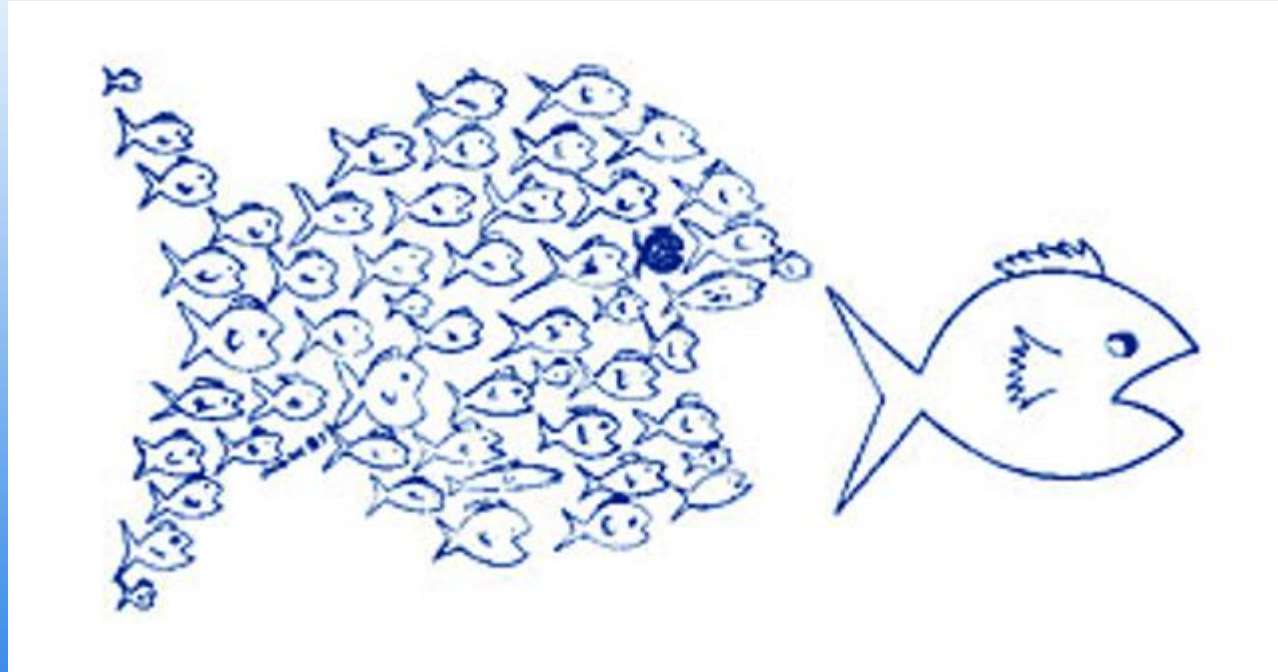

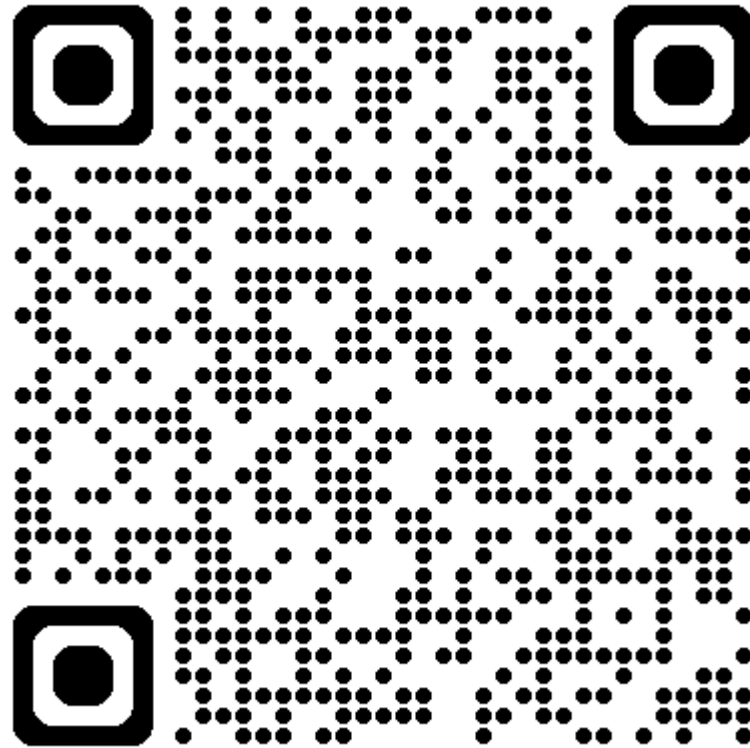

Important Instructions for sections 7, 8, 13 and 14

- 7) Registrants who are submitting this form by mail and are registering to vote for the first time: If you do not supply any of the information required by section 7, or the information you provide cannot be verified, you will be asked to provide a COPY of a current and valid photo ID, or a document with your name and current address on it to avoid having to provide identification at the polling place.
Note: ID Numbers are Confidential and will not be released by any governmental agency. Any person who uses such numbers illegally shall be subject to criminal penalties.
- 8) If you are homeless, you may complete section 8 by providing a contact point or the location where you spend most of your time.
- 13) You may declare a political party affiliation or you may declare to be unaffiliated, regardless of any prior party affiliation. If you are a previously affiliated voter who wants to change political party affiliation or become unaffiliated, you must file this form no later than 55 days before the primary election in order to vote in the primary election. Completing section 13 is OPTIONAL and will not affect the acceptance of your voter registration application.

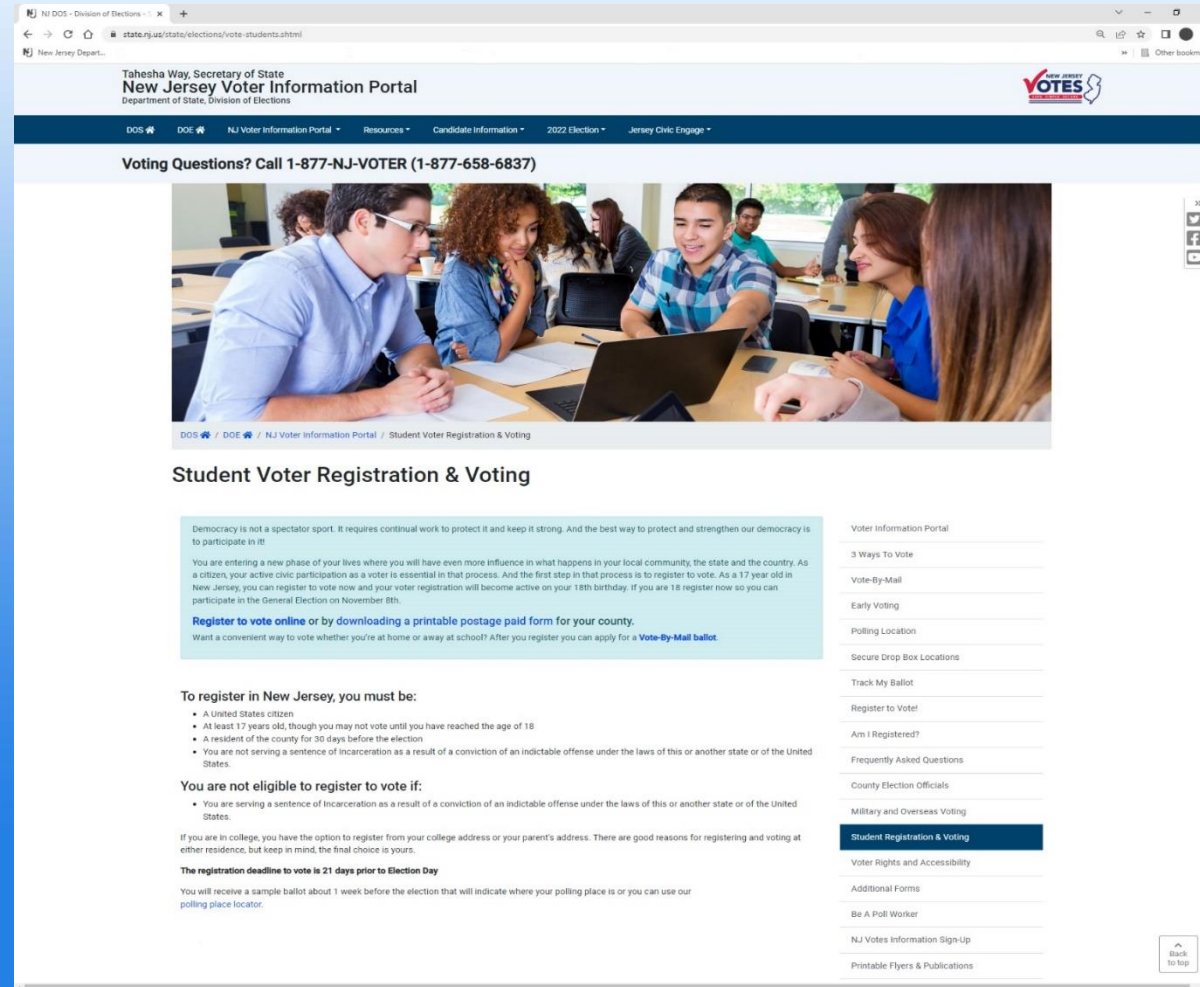

Student Voter Registration & Voting

Democracy is not a spectator sport. It requires continual work to protect it and keep it strong. And the best way to protect and strengthen our democracy is to participate in it!

You are entering a new phase of your lives where you will have even more influence in what happens in your local community, the state and the country. As a citizen, your active civic participation as a voter is essential in that process. And the first step in that process is to register to vote. As a 17 year old in New Jersey, you can register to vote now and your voter registration will become active on your 18th birthday. If you are 18 register now so you can participate in the General Election on November 8th.

Register to vote online or by downloading a printable postage paid form for your county.

Want a convenient way to vote whether you're at home or away at school? After you register you can apply for a **Vote-By-Mail ballot**.

To register in New Jersey, you must be:

- A United States citizen
- At least 17 years old, though you may not vote until you have reached the age of 18
- A resident of the county for 30 days before the election
- You are not serving a sentence of incarceration as a result of a conviction of an indictable offense under the laws of this or another state or of the United States.

You are not eligible to register to vote if:

- You are serving a sentence of incarceration as a result of a conviction of an indictable offense under the laws of this or another state or of the United States.

If you are in college, you have the option to register from your college address or your parent's address. There are good reasons for registering and voting at either residence, but keep in mind, the final choice is yours.

The registration deadline to vote is 21 days prior to Election Day

You will receive a sample ballot about 1 week before the election that will indicate where your polling place is or you can use our polling place locator.

- **Election Day is Tuesday, November 4**
- The polls are open from **6am-8pm**
- Go to Vote.NJ.Gov to find your polling location

In-Person Early Voting

- In-Person Early Voting for the 2025 General Election begins on **Saturday, October 25 and runs through Sunday, November 2**
- Each NJ county will hold nine (9) days of early, in-person machine voting
- Each early voting location will be open **Monday through Saturday** from **10am to 8pm** and **Sunday** from **10am to 6pm**

How Can I Return My Mail-in Ballot?

- **1... Mail:** It must be postmarked on or before 8pm on November 5
- **2... Secure Ballot Drop Box:** Place your ballot in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8:00 p.m. on November 4. Drop box locations can be found at Vote.NJ.Gov
- **3... Board of Elections Office:** Deliver your ballot in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. on November 4. County contact information can be found at Vote.NJ.Gov
- **4.NOTE: Your Mail-in Ballot CANNOT be returned to your early voting location or polling place for this election**





Here are the 3 ways you can vote in the upcoming General Election...

1. AT YOUR POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY



Vote in person at your polling place, from **6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 4**. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

Go to **VOTE.NJ.GOV** for your polling place, listed on the Polling Locations page.

2. IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING



This option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot **in person, using a voting machine, during a nine-day period prior to Election Day**. You can choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule.

No matter where you live in the county, you can vote your specific ballot at any of **your** county's designated in-person early voting sites. Find your county's sites at **VOTE.NJ.GOV**.

In-person early voting sites will be open **Saturday, October 25 through Sunday, November 2**. Hours will be **Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m.** No appointment is necessary. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

3. VOTE BY MAIL



Registered voters can apply for a **mail-in ballot** by following the instructions found at **VOTE.NJ.GOV** or contacting their County Clerk.

Then, VOTE and RETURN your ballot one of the following ways...

- **Secure Ballot Drop Box:** Place your mail-in ballot in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes **by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4**. Drop box locations can be found at **VOTE.NJ.GOV**.
- **Board of Elections Office:** Deliver your mail-in ballot in person to your county's Board of Elections Office **by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4**. County Election Officials' contact information can be found at **VOTE.NJ.GOV**.
- **Mail:** Your mail-in ballot **MUST** be postmarked **on or before 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4** and be received by your county's Board of Elections **on or before Monday, November 10**.

NOTE: Mail-in ballots CANNOT be returned to your early voting site or polling place.

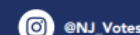
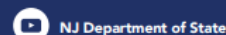
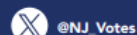
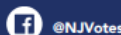

VOTER ALERT: DON'T BE FOOLED BY DEEPPFAKES

WHAT IS A DEEPPFAKE?

Deepfakes are fake or manipulated photos, videos, or audio that appear real, but do not represent actual events. Created using generative AI technologies, they are part of a broader threat of false information designed to mislead and confuse the public. With the presidential election approaching, deepfakes may be used to spread false or misleading information about candidates, political parties, the voting process, voting security, or your right to vote.

For example, earlier this year, thousands of New Hampshire voters received phone calls of President Joe Biden's deepfaked voice encouraging them not to vote in the primary election—a message he never recorded or endorsed. And last year, deepfake photos of former President Donald Trump interspersed with real photos and footage were circulated to damage his reputation.

WHERE MIGHT I SEE A DEEPPFAKE?

You may see deepfakes appear in social media posts, text messages, emails, calls, or voicemails. Deepfakes may appear to come from candidates or campaigns in attempts to influence or interfere with local, state, or federal elections. You may even receive deepfakes from family or friends, who may share them without realizing they are fake. Deepfakes are often used in conjunction with the following types of false information:

Misinformation, Disinformation, and Malinformation

- **MISINFORMATION:** False information shared without harmful intent—people might share it thinking it's true.
- **DISINFORMATION:** Deliberately false information spread with the intent to deceive or mislead.
- **MALINFORMATION:** Information based on reality, but used maliciously to inflict harm on a person, organization, or country.

These tactics are used alongside deepfake technology to distort the truth, undermine trust, and interfere with the electoral process.

HOW TO SPOT A DEEPPFAKE

Many deepfakes are easily created with artificial intelligence tools to look legitimate, making it difficult to recognize manipulated content just by looking or listening to it. When you see content related to an election, remember to **WATCH** out to avoid being duped by deepfakes:

- W WAIT BEFORE SHARING.**
If you are not sure, do not share!
- A ASK QUESTIONS.**
Does the content make sense?
Does it seem off?
- T TRACE THE SOURCE.**
Who sent the content?
Where did it originate?
- C CHECK OFFICIAL.** nonpartisan election sources for trusted information. Research suspicious content by checking credible independent fact-checking sites, such as [PolitiFact](#) or [AP Fact Check](#).
- H HELP** by reporting possible election misinformation to nj.elections@sos.nj.gov.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE NOT SURE

You can stop the spread of deepfakes! One way to stem the spread is to not share any election information unless it is from an official source and has been fact-checked.

WHERE CAN I REPORT HARMFUL DEEPPFAKES?

Deepfakes that undermine the voting and election process, harm voters, or otherwise impact your vote should be reported. You can report potential election-related deepfakes to nj.elections@sos.nj.gov.

NEW JERSEY TRUSTED SOURCES

A **Trusted Source** is an authoritative entity that provides accurate and reliable information, particularly crucial in the context of elections.

Trusted Sources play a vital role in maintaining public confidence in the electoral process by supporting transparency and fairness, helping voters make informed decisions, and understanding the democratic process.

The Role of a Trusted Source

TRUSTED SOURCES combat false information and influence campaigns by providing and promoting accurate, verified information to the public and detecting various types of false information, whether spread intentionally or unintentionally, including:

MISINFORMATION

False information that is not created or shared with the intention of causing harm.

DISINFORMATION

False information intended to mislead, harm, or manipulate a person, social group, organization, or country.

MALINFORMATION

Information based on fact but used out of context to mislead, harm, or manipulate.

Trusted Sources in New Jersey Elections

New Jersey Secretary of State The Chief Election Official of the state.
New Jersey Division of Elections Oversees key administrative and operational duties in the election process.
New Jersey County Election Officials (County Clerk, Board & Superintendent of Elections/Commissioner of Registration) Implements county election procedures, manages voter registration, conducts elections, and ensures compliance with state and federal laws.

7 Steps to Fact-Checking

Use this checklist to ensure the information you find is accurate and reliable:

- ☐ **VERIFY THE SOURCE:**
Check if the information comes from a trusted and credible source.
- ☐ **CHECK THE DATE:**
Ensure the information is current and not outdated.
- ☐ **CROSS-REFERENCE:**
Ensure the information is current and not outdated.
- ☐ **LOOK FOR BIAS:**
Identify if the source has any potential bias or agenda.
- ☐ **CHECK THE AUTHOR:**
Research the author's credentials and background.
- ☐ **EXAMINE THE EVIDENCE:**
Look for supporting evidence and verify the facts presented.
- ☐ **BE SKEPTICAL:**
Approach sensational or emotionally charged information with skepticism.

How to Become a Poll Worker for the General Election

New Jersey's counties, in partnership with the Department of State, Division of Elections, are actively seeking residents to serve as poll workers for the upcoming General Election, Tuesday, November 4, 2025.

Here are the answers to three top questions about becoming a poll worker:

1... WHY SHOULD I APPLY?

Your community needs you! By staffing a polling location, you will:

- Earn \$21.43 per hour on in-person early voting days and \$300 on General Election Day.
- See our great democracy in action, firsthand, and enjoy the feeling that comes with contributing to your local community, your state and your country.

2... WHO CAN APPLY?

You can apply to serve as a poll worker in New Jersey if you:

- Are a United States citizen and a resident of New Jersey.
- Are a registered voter in the county in which you reside.
- Are at least 16 years of age. College and high school students are encouraged to apply.

Note: Those under 18 years of age will work limited hours per shift and do not have to be registered to vote. Contact the County Board of Elections for further information.

- Are not running as a candidate in this election.

3... WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

Possible work dates span Saturday, October 25 through Sunday, November 2 (the in-person early voting period) and Tuesday, November 4 (Election Day). Hours and days may vary.

- **October 14:** Deadline to Register to Vote for the General Election
- **October 22:** Mailing of Sample Ballots Begins
- **October 28:** Deadline to apply for a Mail-in Ballot by Mail for General Election
- **October 25 – November 2:** In-Person Early Voting Period
- **November 3 at 3pm:** Deadline to apply for a Mail-in Ballot in person at your County Clerk's office
- **November 4:** General Election Day - Polls are open from 6:00am-8:00pm
