### **Additional Information for Submitting Your Nominating Petition:**

Hello, we would like to provide you some additional information for submitting your nominating petitions to the Division of Elections.

Be advised that petitions can be submitted in-person or electronically. Whether you are submitting your petition in person or electronically, petitions must be received by 4 p.m. on June 8, 2021.

In-person petition filing is by appointment only prior to Petition Filing Deadline Day. Appointments will be conducted at the NJ State Museum Auditorium located at 205 West State Street in Trenton. To schedule an appointment please visit the candidate information page on our website (<https://nj.gov/state/elections/candidate-petition-filing.shtml>).

Walk-ins will only be available on Petition Filing Deadline day. The filer must be in line on or before 4 p.m. on June 8, 2021.

If you are filing in-person you must wear a mask to enter the building, complete a Covid-19 Health Assessment Form and please practice proper social distancing.

The Division is also accepting petitions through electronic submissions. Please allow ample time before the 4 p.m. deadline when submitting your petitions electronically. The Division of Elections can receive email files up to 25 MB; however, your email client may have different size limitations. In addition, keep in mind there could be technical issues when transmitting your petitions electronically. We suggest that you submit your electronic filing as early as possible to allow time to work through any technical issues that might arise.

After submission, please confirm that the Division has received your electronic filing. If you submit your petition electronically, you do not need to file in person.

Another key item to keep in mind is that incorporated slogans require an authorization letter by the individual who owns the slogan.
