Every Wednesday visit the Imagination Studio to make and take a craft. Stop by for a fun, free family activity or a stress relief moment for yourself! All ages.

- Jul. 10 Make a birch bark box and decorate with Anishinaabe inspired symbols. Get inspiration for your project when you visit the exhibition *Bark! Indigenous Cultural Expressions*.
- Jul. 17 3D DNA Strand. Learn about the building blocks of life and make one to take home. Visit the exhibition *Written in the Rocks* to learn more about life on Earth.
- Jul. 24 Ocean Sensory Tubes. Learn about New Jersey sea life and make a calming ocean-themed sensory tube. Visit *Written in the Rocks* to discovery primordial seas and ancient sea monsters!
- Jul. 31 Make a bark cloth Tapa. You can choose to make note cards or turn it into home décor while you explore Pacific Island tapa symbols. Get inspiration for your project when you visit *Bark! Indigenous Cultural Expressions.*
- Aug. 7 Making Mammoths. Learn the difference between a Mastodon and a Mammoth and make a furry friend to take home. See real mammoth fossils in *Written in the Rocks*.
- Aug. 14 Amate Bark Art. This indigenous art from Mexico is colorful and fun to create. Visit *Bark! Indigenous Cultural Expressions* to see more bark cloth from South America.
- Aug. 21 Aurora Art. Recreate an aurora in the sky and learn more about the interaction of solar wind and the Earth's magnetic field. Visit the Planetarium to see our newest show, *Worlds Beyond Earth*. (Fee for Planetarium show.)
- Aug. 28 Pointillism & Pixels. Combine art and science into a masterpiece to take home! Pointillism uses the science of optics to create colors from many small dots placed so close to each other that they blur into an image to the eye. This is how pixels on computers work today. Combine art and science into a masterpiece to take home! Visit American Perspectives on level 2 to explore examples of Impressionism, a similar and parallel art movement.

Every Thursday morning we have story time in the *Discovery Den* for our smallest visitors. Join us for a story followed by a simple craft.

- Jul. 11 <u>Powwow Day.</u> This book explores the Native tradition of a powwow through the experience of a young girl and its importance to culture and community. Be sure to visit *A Much Moved People* to see regalia on display.
- Jul. 18 Up in the Garden, Down in the Dirt. This book takes you above and below ground to learn all about a garden ecosystem. Be sure to visit the Museum's Pollinator Garden located outside the Planetarium entrance.
- Jul. 25 <u>Who's in the Forest?</u> It's spring and all the forest creatures are coming out of hibernation. This interactive story introduces forest animals in a fun and playful way. Visit *Written in the Rocks* to learn more about New Jersey forest animals.
- Aug. 1Art & Max. Two lizard friends, both artists, take a journey through the art world and explore
many different styles of acrylic, watercolor and line drawings. Get inspired to create your
own masterpiece and visit American Perspectives to see more.
- Aug. 8Toby and the Ice Giants. Join Toby the Bison in this fact-filled adventure as he explores the
Ice Age Tundra and meets some of the giants that roamed its icy surface. Visit Written in the
Rocks to learn more about New Jersey during the last Ice age.
