This chapter governs compensation to condemnees for loss of income resulting from harvesting of standing crops and other agricultural commodities, in compliance with the provisions at N.J.S.A. 20:3-29.

Subchapter 1, General Provisions, provides the purpose of the chapter and the definitions used throughout the rules.

Subchapter 2, Agriculture or Horticultural Land, establishes the criteria for eligibility and valuation.

Subchapter 3, Organization and Procedures, identifies the delegation of authority.

The rules are necessary, reasonable, adequate, and responsive for the purpose for which they were originally promulgated. The Department of Transportation has reviewed the rules and determined that they should be readopted without change. Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c, these rules are readopted and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.
