(Trenton) - New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced an overnight ramp closure and detour on I-287 southbound tonight in Hanover, Morris County.

Beginning at 9 p.m. tonight, Friday, November 1, until 5 a.m., Saturday, November 2, NJDOT's contractor, IEW Construction Group, will close I-287 southbound Exit 39A to Route 10 eastbound to complete concrete repair work. The following signed detour will be in place:

I-287 southbound to Route 10 eastbound detour

- Motorists traveling on I-287 southbound wishing to take the Exit 39A to Route 10 eastbound will be directed to continue on I-287 southbound
- Take Exit 37 towards Route 24 east/Springfield
- Take Exit 2B to CR 510 east/Florham Park
- Keep right and take the first ramp towards Route 24 west/I-287
- Take the ramp to I-287 north/Mahwah
- Take Exit 39 to Route 10 east/Whippany

The work is part of a larger \$20 million state-funded contract to repair and upgrade bridges in various locations in throughout North Jersey.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
