I-80 eastbound ramps to be closed Sunday night in Parsippany-Troy Hills and Fairfield

Closures required for pavement preservation

(Trenton) – New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials Sunday announced that the I-80 eastbound ramps to Route 46 eastbound in Parsippany-Troy Hills and from Two Bridges Road in Fairfield will be closed Sunday night for pavement preservation work.

Beginning at 11 p.m., Sunday, May 22, until 4 a.m., Monday, May 23, NJDOT's contractor, Schifano Construction Corp., is scheduled to close and detour the I-80 eastbound Exit 47B to Route 46 eastbound. In addition, the ramp from Two Bridges Road to I-80 eastbound will be closed and detoured. The closures are necessary for to apply slurry seal. The pavement preservation work is schedule to continue for several weeks. NJDOT will provide more information before any future ramp closures are scheduled. The following detour will be in place:

I-80 eastbound Exit 47B ramp to Route 46 eastbound detour:

- Motorists on I-80 eastbound local wishing to take Exit 47B to Route 46 eastbound will be directed to continue on I-80 eastbound
- Take Exit 45 to Lake Hiawatha/Whippany, *which is before Exit 47B*
- Turn left onto South Beverwyck Road
- Turn right onto Route 46 eastbound

Two Bridges Road ramp to I-80 eastbound:

- Motorists on Two Bridges Road wishing to take the on-ramp to I-80 eastbound will be directed to continue on Two Bridges Road
- Take the ramp onto Route 46 eastbound
- Take the exit for Route 23 North to I-80/Service Road
- Continue on Route 23 northbound
- Take the exit to I-80 East/New York

The work is part of the \$5.5 million federally-funded I-80, Beverwyck Road (CR 637) to Route 23 pavement preservation project to make repairs at various locations in Morris, Essex, and Passaic counties. The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
