I-195 westbound Exit 1A ramp to I-295 southbound to be detoured tonight and tomorrow night in Hamilton Acceleration lane onto I-295 southbound to be closed tomorrow night

(Trenton) - New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the I-195 westbound Exit 1A ramp to I-295 southbound will be detoured tonight and tomorrow night in Hamilton, Mercer County. In addition, the acceleration lane onto I-295 southbound at the I-195 interchange will be closed tomorrow night.

Tonight, Tuesday, September 20

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Tuesday, September 20, until 4 a.m., tomorrow, Wednesday, September 21, NJDOT's contractor, Orchard Holdings, LLC., is scheduled to close and detour the I-195 westbound Exit 1A ramp to I-295 southbound. The closure is necessary for electrical work.

Tomorrow night, Wednesday, September 21

Beginning at 8 p.m. tomorrow night, Wednesday, September 21, until 4 a.m., Thursday, September 22, I-195 traffic wishing to go to I-295 southbound will be detoured. I-195 Exit 1A will only be open for motorists wishing to make a U-turn from I-195 westbound to I-195 eastbound. The acceleration lane onto I-295 southbound will be closed for electrical work. The following detour will be in place on both nights:

I-195 westbound Exit 1A ramp to I-295 southbound:

- Motorists on I-195 westbound wishing to take the Exit 1A ramp to I-295 southbound/Camden will be directed to continue on I-195 westbound, which becomes Route 29 northbound
- Continue on Route 29 northbound
- Take the ramp to South Lambertson Road/Duck Island
- Keep left to take the ramp to Route 29 southbound to I-195 & I-295/Shore Points/Camden
- Take the Exit 1A ramp to I-295 southbound/Camden

The \$1.5 million federally-funded Relamping South project will replace lights in various locations throughout Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Gloucester, Mercer, Monmouth, Ocean, and Salem counties. The project is expected to be completed in fall 2023.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
