Route 3 westbound lane and ramp closures next week in Secaucus, Hudson County **Closures necessary for median reconstruction and guiderail repair**

(Trenton) - New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) officials today announced the left lane on Route 3 westbound Local and the right shoulder on Route 3 westbound Mainline are scheduled to be closed next week for median reconstruction and guiderail repair in Secaucus, Hudson County.

Beginning at 7 a.m. Monday, May 13 until 12 noon Sunday, May 19, the left lane on Route 3 westbound Local is scheduled to be closed beginning at the ramp from Route 495 westbound. At least one lane will be maintained on Route 3 westbound Local. In addition, the ramp from Route 3 westbound Local to Route 3 westbound Mainline near the Exxon at Mill Creek Drive will be closed and detoured. The right shoulder on Route 3 westbound Mainline also will be closed. The closures are necessary for median reconstruction and guiderail repair. The following detour will be in place:

Route 3 westbound Local ramp to Route 3 westbound Mainline at Mill Creed Drive detour:

- Motorists on Route 3 westbound Local wishing to take the ramp to Route 3 westbound Mainline near the Exxon at Mill Creek Drive will be directed to continue on Route 3 westbound Local
- Route 3 westbound Local merges onto Route 3 westbound Mainline after the ramp to Paterson Plank Road/Secaucus

The work is part of a \$6.3 million maintenance contract that will repair guiderail and attenuator in various locations in eight North Jersey counties including Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Morris, Passaic, Sussex, Union and Warren counties.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
