



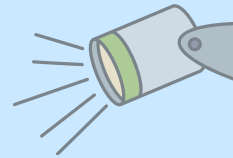

## Weekly Grant Opportunities



The Department of the Treasury's Grants Management Office identifies and compiles potential sources of federal grant funding to create, support, and sustain many types of programs and projects in the state of New Jersey. Each week, the GMO diligently reviews grant eligibility to compile a curated list of opportunities that are open to state and local governments, nonprofits and more.

### E-Learning Collaborative for Integrated Violence Prevention

Department of Health and Human Services

The primary goal is to provide technical assistance and support to the Division of Violence Prevention's funded recipients, sub-recipients, and other prevention practitioners to leverage the best available evidence to select, implement, and evaluate efforts to address multiple types of violence while integrating health equity into prevention efforts.

Funding: \$1,725,000; awards up to \$345,000

Deadline: 10/11/24

### FY 2024 Good Jobs Challenge

Department of Commerce

To support regional workforce training systems in designing and implementing activities for established sectoral partnerships that place program participants in good jobs and advance industries in the federal key technology focus areas.

Funding: \$25 million; awards up to \$8 million

Deadline: 9/27/2024

### Collaborative Research

National Endowment for the Humanities

This program supports groups of two or more scholars seeking to increase humanistic knowledge through convening's, manuscript preparation for collaborative publications, the creation of scholarly digital projects, or the planning of an international collaboration. Projects must pursue significant research questions and lead to a tangible interpretive product.

Funding: \$2,500,000; awards up to \$300,000

Deadline: 11/20/24

## DOE Announces States to Receive \$190 Million to Improve Health, Safety, and Lower Energy Costs in K-12 Public Schools Across America

August 5, 2024- In support of the Biden-Harris administration's investing in America agenda, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) today announced selections for the 2024 Renew America's Schools Prize and Grant, a three phase, \$190 million investment to help K-12 public schools make energy upgrades that will decrease energy use and costs, improve indoor air quality, and foster healthier learning environments for students and teachers. *13 public schools in Irvington, NJ was awarded \$2,359,649.*

## DOI Provides \$325 Million to Increase Access to the Outdoors

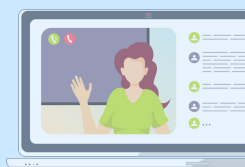
August 8, 2024- Acting Deputy Secretary Laura Daniel-Davis today announced the distribution of \$325 million from the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) Stateside Assistance Program to all 50 states, U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia. Investments from the LWCF are helping support the America the Beautiful initiative by funding locally led outdoor recreation and conservation projects that protect and enhance access to America's great outdoors. *New Jersey was awarded \$8,187,202.*

## DOI Announces Nearly \$47 Million Investment for Community-Led Local Park Projects

August 7, 2024- The Department of the Interior today announced \$46.7 million in funding through the Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership (ORLP) program for the redevelopment or creation of 10 local parks. Through the Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership program, the Interior Department is investing millions of dollars for locally led projects that are creating new city parks and rehabilitating existing outdoor spaces, all driven by the needs and vision of local communities. *New Brunswick was awarded \$2,041,770 towards its Neilson Street Park Project.*
