Full Senate Confirms David Rousseau as State Treasurer

TRENTON – The full New Jersey Senate today confirmed David Rousseau as State Treasurer. He had served as Acting Treasurer since his nomination by Gov. Jon Corzine on January 11.

"I am both humbled and honored to serve the people of New Jersey as State Treasurer," Rousseau said. "I look forward to doing my part along with the rest of the Corzine Administration and the Legislature to ensure that the State's finances and spending are fundamentally sound and serve the best interests of the taxpayers."

Before he became Acting Treasurer, Rousseau was the Senior Advisor to the Governor for Budget and Fiscal Policy and Deputy State Treasurer. He worked closely in those roles with the Governor and Treasurer in developing and implementing the annual State budget and other fiscal policy issues.

Rousseau also served as Deputy State Treasurer from 2002 until 2006 and provided policy guidance to the Governor, Treasurer and Governor's office on areas related to fiscal and budget policy including taxation issues, property tax relief and reform. He also oversaw the operations of the Office of Management and Budget and participated in the operations of the Division of Taxation, Division and Pensions and Benefits and the Office of Public Finance.

Rousseau also served as Senior Policy Advisor to the Senate President focusing on the budget before returning to the Treasury Department.

In addition, he served as the Budget Director for the Senate Democratic office from 1990 to 2002. He moved to the Senate staff after serving as Research and Project Coordinator for the Election Law Enforcement Commission.

Mr. Rousseau received a bachelor's degree from Temple University where he graduated cum laude. He holds an MBA from Rider University.
