## STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

JOINT RESOLUTION ratifying an amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

- I BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. The amendment to the Constitution of the United States proposed at the

- 2 second session of the sixty-first Congress, by a resolution of the Senate and House
- 3 of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, to the
- 4 several State Legislatures, be and the same is hereby, upon the part of this Legis-
- 5 lature, ratified and made a part of the Constitution of the United States of
- 6 America, said amendment having been approved on the fifteenth day of March,
- 7 one thousand nine hundred and nine, and is in the following words, to wit:
- 8 "Article XVI. The congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes on in-
- 9 comes, from whatever source derived, without apportionment among the several
- 10 States, and without regard to any census or enumeration."
