ORDINANCE NO. <u>18-047</u>

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HAMILTON, IN THE COUNTY OF MERCER AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY DISSOLVING HAMILTON TOWNSHIP FIRE DISTRICTS NO. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 AND 9 PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:14-91 AND 40A:5A-20

WHEREAS, the Hamilton Township Council adopted Resolution No. 18-RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HAMILTON, COUNTY OF MERCER AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION TO THE LOCAL FINANCE BOARD FOR THE DISSOLUTION OF HAMILTON FIRE DISTRICTS NO. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 AND 9 PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:14-91AND 40A:5A-20; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5A-20, any municipal governing body which has established a Fire District, is empowered to dissolve the Fire District the Fire District by ordinance, providing said ordinance is approved by the Local Finance Board within the Department of Community Affairs, prior to adoption; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board must approve the dissolution if it finds that said ordinance makes adequate provision for the payment of all creditors or obliges of the authority and that adequate provision has been made for the assumption of those services provided by the Fire District which are necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the recipients of those services; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:48-2 provides that any municipality may make, amend, repeal and enforce such ordinances, as it may deem necessary and proper for the good government, order and protection of persons and property, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of Hamilton, County of Mercer and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. DISSOLUTION. Hamilton Fire Districts No. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 are hereby dissolved and abolished effective January 1, 2019, or such later date, conditioned upon Local Finance Board approval, Civil Service approval/readiness, and a fully executed and approved Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)/Collective Negotiations Agreement (CAN) between representatives unions and Township, subject to the terms and conditions hereof and the terms of the offices of the members of the Board of Commissioners of the HFD are hereby terminated.

SECTION 2. TRANSFER OF TITLE OF ALL FACILITIES. All real and personal property owned or titled in the name of HFD and all monies remaining in HFD's treasury shall be transferred to the Township of Hamilton and all documents and records pertaining to same shall be delivered to the Township Clerk of the Township of Hamilton forthwith.

SECTION 3. PAYMENT OF ALL CREDITORS AND OBLIGEES. The Township of Hamilton shall assume responsibility for the payment of all lawful debts and obligations of the HFD and the Township of Hamilton hereby covenants and agrees to comply with and perform all covenants, obligations and agreements of HFD, except as may be modified between the Township of Hamilton and said creditors and obliges.

SECTION 4. RESERVATION OF RIGHTS. The Township of Hamilton reserves the right to challenge the validity of any and all debts, covenants, obligations and/or agreements of the HFD and to determine whether it is truly a lawful debt, covenant, obligation and/or agreement incurred by the HFD.

SECTION 5. INJUNCTION AGAINST FURTHER ACTION WITHOUT CONSENT. HFD is hereby enjoined from making any further discretionary action without the Township of Hamilton's consent. Simultaneously, upon the effective date of this dissolution as set forth above, HFD shall cease all operations and activities and all operations and activities shall be transferred to the Township automatically and without further action either by the Township of Hamilton or HFD.

SECTION 6. TOWNSHIP AUTHORITY. The Mayor, Township Council, Clerk, Solicitors, and other appropriate employees and professionals of the Township of Hamilton are hereby authorized and directed to undertake any and all such acts and execute any and all such documents as may be necessary to effectuate and accomplish the purposes hereof. The members of HFD, its officers, employees, and representatives are hereby authorized and directed to undertake any and all such acts and execute any and all such documents as may be necessary to effectuate and accomplish the purposes hereof.

SECTION 7. APPOINTMENT OF FIRE CHIEF. The Township shall appoint a Fire Chief in order to implement the Hamilton consolidation transition plan as may be amended from time to time by the Mayor and Township Council. The Fire Chief shall have full operational and management control of the Township Fire Department, paid and volunteer firefighters, during the transition and thereafter, subject to the direction and approval of the Mayor and Township Council.

SECTION 8. ESTABLISHMENT OF HAMILTON TOWNSHIP FIRE DISTRICT CONSOLIDATION SUBCOMMITTEE. A Hamilton Township Fire District Consolidation Subcommittee is hereby established consisting of eight (8) members. The purpose of the Subcommittee shall be to provide advice, information and assistance to the Township of Hamilton regarding fire department matters during the transition period as requested by the Council President. The initial eight (8) members are:

- 1. Jeffrey Martin Council Vice-President
- 2. Ralph Mastrangelo Council Member
- 3. David Kenny Township Business Administrator
- 4. Joe Monzo Volunteer Financial Consultant
- 5. Richard Kraemer Fire Chief
- 6. Scott Goldsmith Volunteer Representative
- 7. Nick Buroczi President of Fire Officers
- 8. Shane Mull Representative of FMBA

SECTION 9. APPROVAL OF LOCAL FINANCE BOARD. Pursuant provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:5A-20, after its introduction and before its adoption, a copy of this Ordinance and application for dissolution shall be submitted to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey ("Board") for review and approval. Final adoption of this ordinance shall be subject to the Board's approval. A copy of the ordinance as adopted shall be filed immediately with the Board and with the Secretary of State of the State of New Jersey.

SECTON 11. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to unconstitutional or invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION 12. REPEAL OF ALL INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. All ordinances of the Township of Hamilton that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication, as required by law, and upon approval by the Local Finance Board.
