3 x 16 x 46 ins.










SANDRA BENSCOTERWoodland Renderings, 1999






Pen and Stand, 1999




MICHÈLE MERCADAL Slouching Towards Buddhism, 1998

HOLLIE HELLER RAMSAY Extension, 1998 Fabric, paper 74 x 25 ins.




SUSAN SHAFTAN







LAURINDA STOCKWELL Ice Floe, 1998 Photos on silk 82 x 42 ins.







