







Martin Ball Thirteenth Prosthesis 1995 Oil on canvas 72 x 48 ins.




Hugo Xavier Bastidas Pedestal 1996 Oil on canvas 36 x 24 ins.





Tim Gaydos The Wall 1995 Acrylic on paper 37 x 29 ins.








