#### CURATOR'S NOTES

This year's New Jersey Arts Annual: Fine Arts features a broad range of artistic practices created by an equally broad range of artists. In putting together this exhibition, some artists were invited to exhibit their work and an equal number were selected from the over 200 entries that were received in response to the call for artists. The installation of this exhibition comes at a very important time in the Jersey City Museum's history, as the Museum is still in the first year of inaugurating its new facility. In acknowledging the importance of this exhibition, the Museum has dedicated its three changing exhibition galleries, as well as its Community Gallery and its atrium space, to exhibiting the work of artists living or working in New Jersey.

The range of experience among the artists in the exhibition varies widely, some, such as Giovanna Cecchetti, Patricia Lay, Sharon Libes, Betty Guernsey, Helen Stummer, and Bill Leech have had very long and successful careers. For other artists, this is the first museum exhibition in which they have participated. All of the artists, however, share a passion for creating their work and, subsequently, sharing their vision with the public eye.

For some, such as Shandor Lafcadio Hassan, the work reveals a journey, both literal and personal, that highlights a very American perspective. For others, such as Young Cheol Yoon, formal concepts, textual repetition, and a deep-seated interest in a labor-intensive process become apparent. Influences evident in the work are as diverse as the works themselves. In the video work of Clifford Owens, for example, the artist has a kind of dialogue with the influence of the early French conceptual artist Marcel Duchamp (1887-1968). The repetitive motion of the body as well as the artist's purposeful arresting of actual time underscores his will to manipulate the spectator's viewing of the work. Similarly, in the work of Arturs Arbuzo D'Anhilli Virtmanis, the form of a mundane object is raised to the status of an art object, (temporarily) immortalized in ethereal materials such as cardboard.


Some narratives, such as those of Dahlia Elsayed, are intensely personal at the same time that they make reference to issues that may confront contemporary audiences in their own lives. By using text in her work, the artist asks the viewer to become involved with the image on two levels, as reader and as spectator. The photography of Meghan Malloy and Betty Guernsey is similar in that it poses female subjects as deciphered by a female artist. Photography is often mistakenly thought to be an example of impartial and direct visions. In fact, the work of these two women illustrates how their own intervention, by either positing themselves as the subject, or by carefully constructing the literal boundaries of the image, influences our reading of the photographic scene. Similar in this respect is the work of Jay Boucher, whose images ask us to consider the similarities between two very different scenes and to ponder the human role that is implied at the same time that it remains unarticulated.


Most significant in the organization of this exhibition was the opportunity to see how much truly innovative, intelligent, and engaging art is currently being made in New Jersey. It is for this reason, particularly, that works that engage a variety of issues with a broad range of formal responses were chosen to be included in this exhibition. Dealing with contemporary themes in visual, textual, subliminal, or conceptual ways, these artists propose responses that are formal, metaphorical, or direct.
