




Peter Homitzky, Hackensack River, Meadowlands, 1981, oil on canvas, 72"  $\times$  72"




St. Clair Adams Sullivan, Water Gap Concert, 1982, oil on canvas,  $28'' \times 36''$ 




Rex Goreleigh, Water Pump (from the Cranberry Series), 1980-81, watercolor,  $16" \times 20"$ 









