





Sanda D. Iliescu Summer Retreat at Still Pond, Maryland, 1990 prisma color pencil, graphite and ink on vellum 9 drawings




John T. Dinkey Jr. Cross Termination, 1991 acrylic on canvas 48 x 48








United Nations in the Age of High Technology: Where is Peace and Unity?, 1990-1991 (Detail on display)




Leonard Byrd Autumn Breeze #22, 1990 photo-assemblage 38.75 x 21.25



Kaare Rafoss Bonsai Progression - Red/Blue Exit, 1990 acrylic on wood 11.75 x 3.25 x 1




